

PROPOSALS FOR EXPENDITURE OF LOCAL REVENUE AND CAPITAL BUDGET SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL LOCAL COMMITTEE (ELMBRIDGE)

SUMMARY:

A leader and assistant will organise constructive play for children under 5 whilst giving support to parents who are disadvantaged for various reasons.

4. What need will this project address? Has anyone been consulted?

Provide a safe environment for parents to discuss problems with trained staff, referral to senior organiser when necessary, reduce isolation for parents lacking support and give information. Health visitors, teachers, social services and the families themselves have been consulted.

also attend.

Families with children under 5 who are under stress for any reason (poverty, domestic abuse, multiple births, drug and alcohol addiction, illness).

The roof is leaking as it is old and in a poor state of repair. The original roofing material is cracked, waterlogged and broken.

L. Holistic Education Lifestyles Project (HELP)

- 2. Organisation responsible for carrying out the project: Youth Development Service
- 3. Description of project:

The project aims to improve young people's access to holistic health advice, including life skills education and sexual health advice with the provision of some supplies, and to specifically target hard to reach young people which is needs led by the young people.

4. What need will this project address? Has anyone been consulted?

The need for the project is demonstrated through the work that has already taken place in East Elmbridge with young people through the development of trusting relationships. Young people who have sought support in one area of their lives have been able to holistically address many other issues that impact on them. This work has provided information regarding the young peoples condition before intervention and how they have changed their behaviours and lifestyles through meeting their needs in a safe and secure environment.

Locally most recent conception data reveals that East Elmbridge has the highest number of conceptions and the highest abortion rate in Surrey, also drug related crime and anti-social behaviour is on the increase.

An over riding issue for the Elmbridge Area is the identified need and demand for health specific information for all young people, with the appropriate staff in a safe and secure environment.

- 6. Who will benefit? Young people in the area.
- 7. Start and completion dates: Funding will enable this project to run for a further year from July 2006, including school holidays.

O. Fencing around Scout and Guide Headquarters in Waverley Road, Oxshott

1. Name of member:

Michael Bennison

- 2. Organisation responsible for carrying out the project: Scout Executive Committee, Oxshott and Friends of Guiding Committee, Oxshott.
- 3. Description of project:

A chainlink fence supported by concrete posts will replace the existing fence, much of which is damaged or destroyed, and extend existing fencing so as to enclose and secure the whole site.

4. What need will this project address? Has anyone been consulted?

The property has been subjected to several acts of vandalism during the past two years and the fencing project will ensure that the site can be fully secured. This will provide a protected and safe environment for the children of the groups who use the site during their weekly meetings. The police have visited the site and the Crown Office who have land bordering part of the property have been consulted.

5. Geographical area covered:

The land surrounding the Scout and Guide Headquarters, Waverley Road, Oxshott.

6. Who will benefit?

The members of Oxshott Guide and Scout groups who are children aged between 5 and 14.

7. Start and completion dates:

March 2006, to be completed this year.

- (i) What is the cost of the project? £5,000 + VAT
- (ii) How much of the total cost this financial year would you like from the Committee? £500

(iii) Where is the rest coming from?

The rest of the funding will come from money raised in equal amounts by each committee, either through letting the halls or specific fundraising events. It is hoped that the Crown office will be prepared to fund the short length of fencing which borders their land, but a decision from them on this matter has not yet been reached.

(iv) Does the project involve ongoing costs such as salaries, maintenance or repair?

As above.

P. New Minibus and Canoe/Trailer Facility Building

1. Name of member:

Michael Bennison

2. Organisation responsible for carrying out the project: 1st Hinchley Wood Scout Group.

3. Description of project:

To construct a building alongside our existing headquarters to contain our group minibus and canoes on their trailer, as well as other trailers and activity equipment.

4. What need will this project address? Has anyone been consulted?

The group currently stores minibus and canoes at locations distributed around the local area. This causes excessive wasted time, costs, delays and inconvenience in providing adventurous activities to the members of the Scout group. The project will allow the group to keep everything undercover on site ready for use, also extending the life and facilitating maintenance.

The Group draws its members from the local area: Hinchley Wood, Thames Ditton, Long Ditton, Claygate, Esher

110 Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Explorer Scouts & Leaders forming the current group membership, as well as Hinchley Wood Guides and members of 10 other Scout groups in Esher District.

People recovering from an accident or illness can use the equipment and people who are looking for help to get on with their lives and maintain their independence after treatment in hospital.

We receive monthly information returns from the area showing that the equipment is in constant use. We use feedback from our survey forms that our service users complete. We have feedback from local nurses and other professionals in the community to identify the needs in the community.

The service can benefit anyone within the Elmbridge community who finds themselves in need. This could be someone needing to borrow a Raised Toilet Seat or Mowbray's (RTS on a frame) used both before and after a knee or hip replacement or needing a small aid such as Helping Hand, a stick which helps with picking things up from the floor – very useful when hips, knees and legs don't bend as well as they once did. Our equipment loan helps reduce social isolation for the most needy, enabling people to leave hospital, take a shopping trip with their carer or a child may need a wheelchair to enjoy life by socialising with friends.
