ARSON REDUCTION	We will aim to reduce the overall number of Arson fires within Elmbridge.	May - Esher We will target the issues surrounding waste management. Each watch will be assigned an area of the station ground to communicate our message of how to avoid their business being targeted by arsonists. A letter will be issued to businesses within our station area giving advice for example on regular collection of refuse from wheelie bins outside their Premises. National and local Arson Reduction leaflets will be ordered and distributed. May & June - Walton Target property arson awareness (FDR1).

July & January 2008 - Walton Elmbridge Borough school arson reduction pack to all schools within Elmbridge and complete visits to all schools within Walton.	
August - Esher and Painshill We will target issues surrounding Fires on heath and common land, working in partnership with the Forestry Commission. We will be very proactive in the problem areas at peak times.	

September & October – Walton and Painshill Carry out leaflet/poster campaign for refuse bins - Education initiative to reduce refuses bin fires.
Increase working relationships with outside agencies e.g. Environmental care and local Police (throughout the year).
November & February 2008 - Walton Target vulnerable business arson premises through education and enforcement
March 2008 - Esher We aim to Reduce Hoax calls by working in close liaison with Surrey Police. We will concentrate on educating school children about the consequences and effects of such calls

	Walton In conjunction with the Arson Task Force we will produce a leaflet for private dwellings regarding the links that graffiti have with Arson attacks. In tandem with the leaflet a patrolling format will be introduced that will be methodical in approach. The areas that we will do reassurance patrols will be identified risk areas from our own statistics and also from information received through Elmbridge Joint Action Group meetings. A Reassurance log sheet will be placed in each of the Fire cars so to enable personnel doing the Reassurance to log any findings or incidents as they patrol areas.
