What are you seeking funding for ?

Q4 Describe the area where the funding applied for would be spent

The area where the funding is being applied for are the wards of St Johns Estate/Walton North and Lower Green (Esher), being 2 of the most disadvantaged areas in the Borough.

Give details of the neighbourhood or locality which is being targeted by this proposal

Q5 Provide evidence of the local needs which the funding would address

Domestic abuse has been highlighted as an area of concern within Elmbridge. The Surrey average of 3.6 incidents per thousand (source: Heatmaps Data Spring 2010) compares with 14.2 in St Johns Estate/Super Output Area EL08A, and 11.2 in Lower Green/Super Output Area EL13D. During 2009/10 the North Surrey Domestic Abuse Outreach (NSDAO) received 539 new referrals of adults experiencing domestic abuse in Elmbridge. It is estimated that within these 2 wards approximately 200 children would have been affected. The NSDAO currently only provides services for adults and does not work directly with children.

Q6 Describe the project or activities you are seeking funding for

There are currently no services in the area specifically targeted at children and young people up to the age of 16 who are witnessing domestic abuse within their families.

The project would recruit a worker who would work the equivalent of one day per week. The project would offer support and advice to children on a one to one basis and by group work, using talking, listening, play and creative activities at locations within the area e.g. SureStart Children Centres & schools.

Our Domestic Abuse Outreach Service already has links with the Children Centres. Where appropriate, we would work with other agencies to support the children and young people.

The project would be delivered with strict adherence to child protection procedures and the Children Act 1989. Referrals will be taken from the children themselves, parents, and our own domestic abuse outreach, schools, social workers, health professionals, Surrey Police, voluntary sector organisations and any other organisation that has concerns about a child. We would also refer parents on to our existing adult domestic abuse service as required.

Briefly describe the proposed actions and the activities that will be undertaken; explain how the project would offer something new to the area

Q7 What outcomes and outputs will you be aiming to achieve and how do they help SCC achieve its strategic priorities? Please also say what SCC services are involved and the named contact(s).

The objectives of the project are to:

- 1. Enable children to express and understand their feelings, build confidence and self-esteem to go on to achieve well and understand healthy relationships.
- 2. Support children and young people to feel safe and to recognise that they are not the only one to have experienced domestic abuse.

The outputs of reaching these objectives would be:

- 1. Individual safety plans with useful contact details will be developed with (50%) children within the project.
- 2. Feedback from the individuals and schools to show an improvement in the behaviour of the children at school, and performance had improved.

2. PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY

Parents and children will be encouraged to assume responsibility for their behaviour and addressing their needs to provide safe family environments.

3. DECIDING AND DELIVERING LOCALLY

Local service users and agencies will be invited to suggest how the service may be developed and improved to meet local needs.

4. PREVENTION

The project will minimize the risk of children experiencing further risk and harm and refer parent victims to appropriate services to reduce repeat victimisation.

5. WORKING TOGETHER

The project can only succeed with support and cross referrals from other agencies. The NSDAO already has an excellent record of multiagency working e.g. MARACs.

Q8 How would you involve residents in the project?

Referrals will be made through existing contacts within relevant SCC services and partner agencies. These contacts would be maintained and would support the development of relationships between the young individuals and the Outreach Worker.

Relationships with the key partners who would be promoting the project such as the Children Centres, Elmbridge Housing Trust and Elmbridge Borough Council already exist through current multi-agency work being carried out in Elmbridge such as MARACs, The Sanctuary Scheme and Homelessness Forum.

Describe how you would establish a relationship with residents and voluntary organisations

Q9 The fund is available for one year only; how will any project initiated during this period be sustained in the longer term?

Using the success of the project we would seek funding from alternative charitable and statutory sources to develop the service. This would include working in partnership with the SCC Domestic Abuse strategy group and the Community Safety Partnership.

We would also encourage parents to continue group sessions within their children's schools or other community environments to ensure the sustainability and longevity of the individual support.

Explain how you intend to develop local capacity to sustain the project after the funding ends.

Q10 How will you measure your success in carrying out the activities and achieving the outcomes you have set out above?

- We don't want to create reporting burdens so do keep systems simple, realistic and informative.
- 1. Individual Safety Plans would be established and reported back to the North Surrey Domestic Abuse Outreach when completed.
- 2. Schools to report back to NSDAO the attendance figures of the young people within the project at the close of the school year.
- 3. Feedback from children; parents; schools; children centres and other agencies to be sought through formal reporting and oneto-one meetings with children and parents.
