Cabinet Priorities

Purpose of the report: Policy Development and Review

Introduction:

- The current Cabinet Priorities are listed for the Transport portfolio. The Cabinet Priorities for the Environment portfolio will be considered at the meeting of the Committee to be held on November 10th 2011.
- It has been agreed that this information will be included on an annual basis for each of the Select Committees. This will enable Select Committees to ensure that their Forward Work Plan reflects and is informed by these priorities.

- The Transport portfolio, held by Cabinet Member Ian Lake contains seven objectives. All of the objectives are relevant to the Environment and Transport Select Committee's work.

- The Cabinet Priorities for the Environment portfolio to be considered at the November 10th Meeting of the Committee.
- Formal invitation to Cabinet Members to attend the Communities Select Committee on an annual basis.
