# LOCAL COMMITTEE IN EPSOM & EWELL MEMBERS' ALLOCATIONS 14 SEPTEMBER 2009

## **KEY ISSUE**

To consider new proposals for expenditure from the Members' Allocations budget 2009/10.

#### **SUMMARY**

This report sets out new schemes suggested by Members for funding from the Members' Allocations budget.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Committee is asked:

To approve the proposed expenditure from the Members' Allocations budget.

#### 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Each Member of the County Council has been allocated a budget of £8,250 in 2009/10 to be spent in accordance with his/her wishes on schemes and projects, which promote social, environmental or economic well-being. Each Member's proposal will require the approval of the Local Committee.
- 1.2 The Committee has also been allocated a capital grant of £35,000. This funding may only be used for capital projects and schemes. It will be allocated equally on a Division basis of £7,000 each, subject to agreement by the whole of the Local Committee.

#### 2. <u>MEMBERS' REVENUE ALLOCATION – NEW FUNDING BIDS</u>

2.1 CHRISTMAS LIGHTS FOR EPSOM TOWN CENTRE

Funding is requested to purchase and erect additional Christmas lights for the town centre to improve and extend the seasonal display.

2.2 VEHICLE ACTIVATED SIGN FOR LONGDOWN LANE SOUTH
A number of accidents have occurred near the bend in Longdown Lane
South. The installation of a new vehicle activated sign showing 'Bend' would slow down traffic approaching the bend thereby improving safety.

#### 2.3 INTERGEN

Banstead, Epsom and Ewell Community Learning Partnership seeks to purchase a bank of 12 laptops for use at the Longmead Centre to facilitate access to adult learning in the community and narrow the 'digital divide' that exists. Initially, the equipment would benefit the newly-established 'Intergen' 50+ group of 'silver surfers' currently taking computer courses at the Longmead Centre. (ICT equipment used for this training has been on short-term loan from Surrey Lifelong Learning Partnership and is soon due to be returned.) Access to the new equipment could also be extended to a group of single mothers interested in developing their employability and communications skills, and possibly to a group of children with no computer at home for whom a "homework club" could be established. An application for funding for an additional set of 5 computers has been submitted to the Comic Relief fund.

At the request of local residents and supporters of Ewell Court House, funding is requested to contribute to the cost of installing local direction signs directing users to Ewell Court House. Two white traffic signs would be placed on the A240 (Kingston Road) at specified locations. The application requests 50% of the costs, with the remainder coming from Epsom & Ewell Borough Council.
