

FORWARD PROGRAMME – SCHEDULE FOR REPORTS SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL LOCAL COMMITTEE (GUILDFORD) 30th March 2006

KEY ISSUE

The Forward Programme for the Local Committee for 2006/7.

SUMMARY

This report sets out the possible sequence of reports for the municipal year of 2006/7. The Committee are asked to consider those local items and issues that it wishes to include in the Forward Programme. Early indications would help officers to investigate, consult and prepare any additional reports.

OFFICER RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Committee should:

- 1) Agree the Forward Programme, as outlined in Appendix 1.
- 2) Comment on the suggestions on the future style and focus of meetings (as outlined in section 1)
- 3) Consider and indicate further preferences for inclusion in the Forward Programme, 2006/7.

1 Introduction and Background

1.1 The Forward Programme of the Local Committee is revised at each Committee meeting. Members are requested to propose any additional items for inclusion on the Programme. Officers are then required to investigate and consult with the appropriate services, partners or other agencies on the purpose, content and timing of future reports. As these negotiations are concluded then items are added to the Programme.

- 1.2. Currently, discussions are underway in Surrey County Council (SCC) in the light of the roll-out of the Business Delivery Review (BDR) and the desire to revise the way that all its Committee business is conducted. This is wider than just Local Committees and it is expected that recommendations will be made to the Annual Meeting of the County Council on 2nd May 2006.
- 1.3. At this stage it is not certain what the recommendations to the County Council will be. It is anticipated that the role of the elected Member as a community leader advocating on behalf of their constituents and able to influence the work of the Executive and Select Committees will feature. What is also expected is that the formal decision-making meetings of Local Committees be complemented by Members promoting a number of public engagement events of priority cross-cutting themes. It is suggested that these themes could include:
 - Every Child Matters
 - Community Safety and Anti-Social behaviour
 - Sustainability issues, such as waste, re-cycling, heritage and the environment
 - Health and Social Care
 - Life-long Learning
 - Self Reliance (or Social Inclusion)
- 1.4. The re-focussed services following BDR will be working to set priorities and reduced capacities. Coupled with the changes to the Local Partnerships Team in 2005, it is anticipated that the officer support to Local Committees will only deliver up to 4 formal Local Committees per borough per year. However, as suggested in paragraph 1.3., above, these formal meetings could alternate with up to 4 informal public engagement events, where Standing Orders will not apply and a more twoway process with the public could be fostered.
- 1.5. Finally, it is suggested that a number of private briefing sessions with Members (which could include GBC Members, as appropriate) could be arranged with those services and partner agencies where complex, confidential or sensitive information could be shared. The views of Members on these matters would be very helpful to planning dates, venues and topics for future meetings.
