

PROPOSALS FOR THE COMMITTEE'S REVENUE AND CAPITAL ALLOCATIONS

14th December 2006

KEY ISSUE/DECISION:

To set out the funding available for County Councillors' allocations for 2006/07, and consider the requests received.

SUMMARY

This report lists and makes recommendations on bids received for Members' Allocations, which have been sponsored by at least one Member.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee is asked to approve the proposed expenditure from the Members' Revenue Allocation budget listed in paragraph 4.

BACKGROUND

- The budget for 2006/07 made available delegated funding to be spent on local projects to promote the social, environmental or economic well-being of the people of each borough or district area. This amounts to £11,000 for each County Member of the Committee.
- 2 An additional capital allocation of £35,000 for voluntary or community organisations has been made available to each Surrey County Council Local Committee.

The sums currently committed are set out in the attached schedule, together with the balance remaining to be committed (Appendix A).

 - a. £2000 for Improved signage and markings on York Rd. & Chertsey St. (£1000 each from David Goodwin & Sarah Di Caprio)
 - b. £1110 for Bellfields Residents Association (Pauline Searle)
 - c. £1000 for the Stoughton Youth Club (Pauline Searle).
 - d. £1000 for the development of a business plan for Guildford Together Consortium (Eddie Owen).
 - e. £4679 for the outdoor area at Merrow Infants School (Eddie Owen)
 - f. £3000 for the refurbishment of St Albans Hall, Wood St (Mike Nevins)
 - g. £1500 for water fountains at Pirbright Village Primary School (Mike Nevins)
 - h. £2000 for the turning circle & fencing at Worplesdon Primary School.
 - i. £1000 for wicket restoration work at Normandy Cricket Club.
 - £1000 for the clearance, levelling and reseeding of the area adjacent to the Millennium Well for Jacobs well Residents Association. (Mike Nevins).

The details of the individual proposals are appended to this report (Appendix B).

A separate item on the agenda for this meeting considers the revised Local Committee protocol which includes a proposal that the Local Committee in Guildford adopts the practice of allowing decisions on revenue proposal up to £1,000 under certain circumstances (detailed in the revised protocol) to be delegated to the Area Director.

PROPOSALS FROM THE CAPITAL ALLOCATION

There are no proposals from the remaining capital allocation (£26,692) for this meeting. Members have indicated that these funds be used for equipment or facilities for young people. Officers are currently inviting proposals from voluntary and community groups in the borough. Any proposals received will be put to the Committee on March 22nd for consideration and decision.

CONSULTATIONS

7 The appropriate SCC services and partner agencies for each proposal have been consulted as detailed in each proposal document (Appendices B).

ITEM 11

IMPLICATIONS (FINANCIAL, EQUALITIES, RISK, SAFETY, ENVIRONMENTAL)

The proposals in this report are intended to enhance the wellbeing of Guildford residents and make best possible use of the funds available to the Local Committee.

- In particular the contribution to the Bellfields Residents Association will help provide the much needed drop in sessions for vulnerable and elderly people in the area.
- Similarly the funding of the equipment for Stoughton Youth Club will provide opportunities for young people, which are currently not available.

CONCLUSION AND REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The spending proposals put forward for this meeting have been assessed for appropriateness and value for money and it is recommended that they should be approved, to enhance the wellbeing of Guildford residents.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT:

Should members agree the proposals, Officers will require recipient agencies to sign a brief funding agreement form (based on the attached documents and Committee's decision), and then transfer funds when the agency requires. Recipient agencies are required to: account for the way the money has been spent, identifying where outcomes have been achieved, include a credit for SCC Local Committee in any publicity, and meet other conditions of the funding agreement. Officers will continue the practice of preparing an annual report on the outcomes of the previous year's funding.

At present two Pegasus buses accommodate 50-60 children daily resulting in a reduction in the number of cars arriving and parking outside the school. The layout of the roads and school site it is not possible to get the buses onto the school site. Therefore they drop of the children and collect from an adjoining street. With the number of children using this service, movement of children across two roads is potentially dangerous and difficult to supervise. The school has recently placed an order for road alterations to enable the buses to turn onto the school site but alterations will need to be carried out within the school site and will require fencing and tarmac being reinforced to support the movement and turning of buses. Increased safety for 50 – 60 children daily
