

PROPOSALS FOR THE COMMITTEE'S REVENUE AND CAPITAL ALLOCATIONS

22nd March 2007

KEY ISSUE/DECISION:

To agree projects to be funded by County Councillors' revenue allocations and the Committee's capital allocation for 2006/07. The amount of funding being considered at this meeting is approximately £100,000.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee is asked to approve the proposed expenditure from the Members' Revenue Allocation budget listed in paragraph 3 (and detailed in Appendix A) and capital allocation listed in paragraph 8 below (and detailed in Appendix B).

BACKGROUND

- 1 The budget for 2006/07 made available delegated funding to be spent on local projects to promote the social, environmental or economic well-being of the people of each borough or district area. This amounts to £11,000 for each of the 10 County Council Members of the Committee (a total of £110,000). About £75,000 worth of revenue allocations is presented below for consideration at this meeting.
- 2 An additional capital allocation of £35,000 mainly for voluntary or community organisations has been made available to each Surrey County Council Local Committee. Over £26,000 worth of the capital allocation is presented below for consideration at this meeting.

- 5 Proposals to a value of £1000 or less have been submitted in recent days by some Members; these will be passed to the Area Director for consideration under delegated authority. A list of these schemes will be included for information in a report to the next Local committee meeting in June 2007.
- 6 Members with any outstanding revenue allocations are able to propose projects for £1,000 or less for approval by the Area Director before the end of March 2007. Any balances not committed by the end of March 2007 will be returned to the central budget.
- 7 Members are asked to give early consideration to projects they might wish to fund from 2007/08 revenue allocations (which have been confirmed again at £11,000 per Member), perhaps aiming to agree at least 50% of the funding in the first 2 (of the 4) Committee meetings of the year. Early agreement of funds would support the County Council's aim to reduce the level of funding carried forward from one financial year to the next.

PROPOSALS FROM THE CAPITAL ALLOCATION

8 As stated in the committee report which went to the Local Committee (Guildford) on 14th December 2006. £26.692 of the capital allocation was still remaining. £8,308 of the £35,000 had been agreed at earlier committees to fund St Peters School basketball equipment (£1,508), furniture for Relate (£1,800) and music equipment for community centres in Guildford (£5,000). Members had indicated that the remaining funds were to be used for equipment or facilities for young people. Officers have invited proposals (of approximately £5,000 each) from voluntary and community groups in the borough and those which have been received are listed below, and detailed in Appendix B. The proposals that have been received total £50,316 and therefore the Members of the Committee are asked to decide which of the organisations they wish to fund. (If Members require further information about these bids, they are asked to contact officers prior to the Committee meeting.)

- a) £5000 to purchase a secondhand minibus for the YMCA.
- b) £6000 to purchase a minibus for Guildford Air Cadets.
- c) £7310 to build/convert suitable working space for George Abbot Schools Relational worker
- d) £4981 to complete refurbishment of the Felbury Centre
- e) £6945 for mobile cinema & projection facilities for the Lockwood Digital Media Centre.
- f) £4380 for gardening equipment for the Ready 4 Action project.
- g) Up to £7600 for the 'Big Youth Night' events at St Johns Church, Stoke, Guildford.
- h) £8100 for equipment for the Wey Kayak Club.

CONSULTATIONS

9 The appropriate SCC services and partner agencies for each proposal have been consulted as detailed in each proposal document, appended to this report.

IMPLICATIONS (FINANCIAL, EQUALITIES, RISK, SAFETY, ENVIRONMENTAL)

- 10 The proposals in this report are intended to enhance the wellbeing of Guildford residents and make best possible use of the funds available to the Local Committee.
- 11 As examples, the purchase of community notice boards for the wards of Friary & St Nicolas and Onslow will assist in the strengthening of community relations in these areas by promoting community activities.
- 12 And the funding towards the pedestrian access at Wood St Infant school will promote safer and more sustainable transport to school.

CONCLUSION AND REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

13 The spending proposals put forward for this meeting have been assessed for appropriateness and value for money and it is recommended that they should be approved, to enhance the wellbeing of Guildford residents.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT:

14 Should Members agree the proposals, officers will require recipient agencies to sign a brief funding agreement form (based on the attached documents and Committee's decision), and then transfer funds when the agency requires. Recipient agencies are required to: account for the way the money has been spent, identifying where outcomes have been achieved, include a credit for SCC Local Committee in any publicity, and meet other conditions of the funding agreement. Officers will continue the practice of preparing an annual report on the outcomes of the previous year's funding.

15 Members may wish to consider how they intend to spend the capital allocation of £35,000 which the committee will have available for 2007/8. For example Members may choose, like this year, to agree a theme for the funding, and ask officers to invite bids from relevant voluntary or community groups.
