

PROPOSALS FOR THE COMMITTEE'S CAPITAL AND REVENUE ALLOCATIONS

SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL LOCAL COMMITTEE (GUILDFORD)

8th OCTOBER 2008

KEY ISSUE/DECISION:

To agree projects to be funded by the Committee's capital and revenue allocations for 2008/09.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee is asked:

- a. to note the allocations agreed under delegated authority from the 2008/09 budget since the Local Committee meeting held on 18 June 2008 (paragraph 5).
- b. to approve the proposed expenditure from the Members' Revenue Allocation budget listed in paragraph 6 (and detailed in Appendix A).

BACKGROUND

- The County Council's revenue budget for 2008/09 made available delegated funding to be spent on local projects to promote the social, environmental or economic well-being of the people of each borough or district area. This amounts to £11,000 for each of the 10 County Council Members of the Committee (a total of £110,000).
- An additional capital allocation of £35,000 mainly for voluntary or community organisations has been made available to each Surrey County Council Local Committee.

The Local Committee also has a separate local capital allocation of £100,000, which it has been agreed, will be used for highway purposes in 2008/09.

PROPOSALS FROM THE CAPITAL ALLOCATION FOR 2008/09

At the committee meeting held on 18th June 2008 Members agreed that a theme of older and vulnerable people, and carers be applied to the Capital allocation for the capital funding in 2008/9. Bids have been invited from voluntary and community groups providing services to older or vulnerable adults and/or their carers in the Guildford borough area. The deadline for the submission of bids has been set at 31st October 2008. The proposals received will be brought to the Local Committee to be held on 10th December 2008.

PROPOSALS FROM INDIVIDUAL REVENUE ALLOCATIONS

The following projects have been agreed by the Area Director under delegated authority since the Local Committee meeting held on 18th June 2008:

From the 2008/9 budget:

- £750 for Local Democracy Week (Bill Barker £530/David Davis -£110/Eddie Owen - £110)
- b. £300 for 'Free & For Nothing' (Eddie Owen)
- c. £1000 for IT equipment & website set up for Stoughton Community Association (Pauline Searle)
- d. £600 for a fax and photocopier for Surrey Welfare Rights (Fiona White)
- e. £400 for coach hire for outing to Worthing for Park Barn & Westborough senior residents. (Fiona White)
- f. £350 for Clean Up & Fun day in Park Barn & Westborough (Fiona White)
- 6 Proposals for consideration and decision at this meeting are:
 - a. £2,500 towards the installation of a play area for Normandy PC (Mike Nevins)
 - b. £2,500 towards new changing and social facilities at Worplesdon Sports Pavilion. (Mike Nevins)
 - c. £4,000 for the Malawi trip for residents of Libertas (£1,000 each from Fiona White/Bill Barker/Eddie Owen/Pauline Searle)
 - d. £1,500 for the Early Learning Scheme at the Raleigh School (Bill Barker)
 - e. £1,250 for new fencing for Albury Parish Council (David Davis)
 - f. £5,000 for ball court on Bushy Hill Estate (Eddie Owen)

Members are asked to give early consideration to projects they might wish to fund from 2008/09 revenue allocations. Early agreement of funds would support the County Council's aim to reduce the level of funding carried forward from one financial year to the next. Members are advised that the County Council's corporate finance officers will require **all** funding to be committed by 28 February 2009 (i.e. for amounts over £1,000 at the first 3

Local Committee meetings of the year; the last committee falls on 11 March 2009).

CONSULTATIONS

The appropriate SCC services and partner agencies for each proposal have been consulted as detailed in each proposal document, appended to this report.

IMPLICATIONS (FINANCIAL, EQUALITIES, SAFETY, ENVIRONMENTAL)

The proposals from the Members' allocations revenue are intended to enhance the wellbeing of Guildford residents and make best possible use of the funds available to the Local Committee.

CONCLUSION AND REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The spending proposals from the Members' allocations revenue put forward for this meeting have been assessed for appropriateness and value for money and it is recommended that they should be approved, to enhance the wellbeing of Guildford residents.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT:

- Should Members agree the proposals from the Members' allocations revenue, officers will require recipient agencies to sign a brief funding agreement form (based on the attached documents and Committee's decision), and then transfer funds when the agency requires. Recipient agencies are required to: account for the way the money has been spent, identifying where outcomes have been achieved, include a credit for SCC Local Committee in any publicity, and meet other conditions of the funding agreement. Officers will continue the practice of preparing an annual report on the outcomes of the previous year's funding.
- As part of their community leadership role, many Members will be in ongoing contact with projects for which they have proposed and secured funding. The input and perspective of Members on the effectiveness of local projects will be an important contribution to the ongoing monitoring of this funding.

Libertas is taking 8 young people, 'looked after' by Surrey County Council, to Malawi. They will be working as volunteers at an orphanage and also installing water pumps in a village. The young people will see a less developed country and see the reality for children and young people who have to survive with no state help or benefits. It is expected that the young people will gain an appreciation for the support that is available to them in Surrey. It will promote independence for the young people and to give them life chances and opportunities to aspire to in the future. In the last five years Libertas has been working to achieve higher standards in education and employment in an effort to break the cycle of being dependant on the state.
