

# REVIEW OF PARKING RESTRICTIONS IN AREAS OUTSIDE THE GUILDFORD TOWN CENTRE CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE

## SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL LOCAL COMMITTEE (GUILDFORD)

#### **KEY ISSUE**

The report suggests the scope for a review of the need for parking restrictions in a number of areas in the borough outside the Guildford town centre Controlled Parking Zone and suggests a method of assessing requests for controls at individual locations.

#### SUMMARY

The report presents a list of requests for parking restrictions outside the Guildford Town Controlled Parking Zone and recommends a method for prioritising these. It recommends that proposals be developed in a number of areas, including Stoughton, Park Barn and Slyfield and that they be subject to consultation and Local Committee approval prior to being formally advertised.

#### OFFICER RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee is asked to agree:

- (i) that proposals for parking restrictions in areas described in paragraphs 13 to 18 concerning Stoughton, Park Barn and Slyfield be developed and subject to informal consultation.
- (ii) that following this consultation, the proposals are considered by the Local Committee prior to being formally advertised.
- (iii) that as described in paragraphs 19 and 20, the list of requests for parking restrictions detailed in **ANNEXE 2** which are not highlighted be assessed using the method set out in **ANNEXE 3** and that recommendations be brought to Local Committee on which locations should be actioned and in which order.
- (iv) that, as described in paragraphs 22 to 24, any proposals to amend to the order to accommodate newly created vehicle accesses or disabled bays be formally advertised, regardless of their locality and if there are no unresolved objections that an order is made giving affect to the change.

#### INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- In December 2004 the Local Committee agreed a cycle of reviews alternating between the Guildford town centre controlled parking zone (CPZ) and the areas outside the CPZ. A schematic representation is attached as **ANNEXE 1**. It was envisaged that each cycle would take 18 months with implementation of the changes from one review being implemented during the last six months and coinciding as the design phase for the next review.
- In general, this timetable is being met, although there have been occasions when other work has had to take precedence, such as the adoption of the Traffic Management Act 2004.
- The most recent review of the CPZ has been substantially completed. The review resulted in a further eastward extension of the CPZ, changes to the existing area boundaries within the CPZ and various other ad-hoc changes, to increase space, where possible, and accommodate newly constructed driveways, where necessary. The possibility of extending the control hours of the CPZ to include Sundays was also considered but in view of the results of a consultation this was not progressed at this stage.
- There are proposed changes in South Hill and Castle Street to improve traffic flow on a Sunday when parking on single yellow lines cause problems with traffic movement. These proposals will be advertised shortly and any objections reported back to the Local Committee.

- This report considers the scope for a review of the outer areas. There are a number of constraints on the extent to which additional restrictions can be created and operated. When Decriminalised Parking Enforcement (DPE) was adopted the agency agreement between the County and Borough Councils maintained the Local Committee's financial responsibility for the existing enforcement within the CPZ, but the County Council's Executive (now Cabinet) became responsible for all new enforcement including the enforcement of all yellow lines and parking places outside the CPZ.
- The County Council's Executive initially restricted the number of Civil Enforcement Officers (then called Parking Attendants), tasked with enforcing the additional restrictions across the county to 22. Guildford was allocated 3 officers.
- With a fixed resource to enforce over 100km of waiting restrictions, some restrictions operating 24 hours a day, and a number of areas with limited waiting bays, officers have expressed concern about increasing quantity and geographical spread of the restrictions. This could dilute the available enforcement further and mean new restrictions were not effectively enforced and existing restrictions were enforced less. However County Council Officers now have flexibility to agree increases to the number of CEOs employed for such duties if there is a robust case to justify the position.
- The concerns above lead to a recommendation to employ a consultant to study the areas where parking restrictions had been suggested and look at where new restrictions would be most effective and assess what their impact would be on enforcing the existing restrictions.
- In view of the changed position regarding potentially increasing the enforcement resources available this report recommends that officers look at the main areas identified in previous reports and that a scoring system is adopted to look at other areas where requests have been made.

#### **ANALYSIS**

- Previous reports have identified the areas of Ash, Ripley, Stoughton, Westborough, and Slyfield Industrial Estate as areas needing to be reviewed. The last review of restrictions outside the CPZ reviewed the situation in Ash and Ripley.
- In addition to those areas listed in paragraph 10 there are a large number of other areas where restrictions have been requested at particular locations. A full list of requests for restrictions is attached as **ANNEXE 2** with the areas specified in paragraph 10 highlighted.
- It is recommended that the Committee agree that the issues outlined in the following paragraphs form the scope of this review of the outer areas.

**ITEM 10** 

#### **Stoughton**

- In late 2008 the County Council consulted on various options to resolve some of the traffic issues in Grange Road, including the introduction of a one-way system, or revisions to the parking controls. The latter, parking restriction-based option was preferred.
- 14 Concerns have also been received regarding parking on the pavement in Worplesdon Road and general parking around its junctions with Byrefield Road and Sheepfold Road. The Committee has also agreed proposals to alter the junction with Byrefield Road and new restrictions would assist these improvements.
- Various roads in Stoughton are already subject to parking restrictions, and form a small, localised controlled parking zone. There is a need to review these to deal with issues that have arisen, and where possible, seek opportunities to create additional parking. This will be done in conjunction with the previously highlighted issues in Grange Road and the junctions of Worplesdon Road.
- There have been calls from some residents in the area for residents' priority measures to be introduced. It is apparent, however, that the majority of issues tend to occur in the evening and at weekends, which would suggest that residents are themselves the cause of the issues. In these circumstances, residents' priority measures are unlikely to assist the situation.

#### Park Barn

Southway in Park Barn does not currently have any parking restrictions, although there are controls nearby in Egerton Road and Aldershot Road. All-day parking possibly by university students in Southway causes safety and access issues and impacts on the availability of parking for residents and visitors to the shopping parade.

#### Slyfield

The main roads in the Slyfield Industrial Estate were re-engineered to control and restrict the areas in which vehicles could park. However the result changed the layout of the road and existing parking restrictions are not enforceable as a result. These need to be reviewed and it also maybe necessary to look at measures beyond the industrial estate in Woodlands Road to pre-empt possible displacement.

#### **Other Areas**

In addition to these geographic-based reviews, requests have been received for the consideration of controls in over 100 other locations. These locations are those listed in **ANNEXE 2** without highlighting. Issues raised involve safety, access, obstruction, prioritisation and environmental concerns.

- It is proposed that the analysis spreadsheet shown in **ANNEXE 3** is adopted and used to prioritise the requests in **ANNEXE 2** which are not highlighted. In the first instance, this is likely to take the form of a desktop study, before recommendations are made to the Committee and more involved investigation of the issues is undertaken and proposals developed.
- Since the original consolidation orders were made in June 2004 a number of amendments orders have been made to the Guildford Town Non-CPZ and Parished Areas orders. Therefore, to bring these orders into line with the Guildford Town Centre Controlled Parking Zone consolidation order 2009, ideally the Guildford Town Non-CPZ and Parished Areas orders and amendments should also be consolidated.
- In addition there are regular requests for parking bays to be adapted when new vehicle crossovers are created which conflict with a bay. These are authorised by SCC officers. However changes to parking places have to be advertised and objections sought in the normal way and any unresolved objections considered by the committee. These changes have in the past been considered when the area is reviewed but the cyclic process of reviewing areas has lead to some requests, received at the wrong time in the cycle, having to wait for up to 2 years.
- The same is true of disabled parking facilities, the need for which is assessed by SCC officers. Those who qualify may be eligible for a disabled bay to be marked outside or near their home, which must be advertised with timescales as in paragraph 22.
- It is therefore recommended that authority be given for such changes to be advertised, with any other changes agreed by the Local Committee, so that these requests can be dealt with more quickly. It is also recommended that the Local Committee consider any objections to such changes, but where there are no objections that an order is made without reference to the Committee.

#### **OPTIONS**

- The proposed emphasis of the review is to consider long-standing issues in a small number of geographic locations (Stoughton, Park Barn and Slyfield). As a result, it is envisaged that it will be possible to consider only a small number of the other 140+ locations where concerns have been raised.
- If the Committee is so inclined, a greater number of the 140+ issues raised could be considered. However, this would result in it not being possible to address a number of the long-standing issues during the present review, and this course of action is therefore not recommended.

#### **CONSULTATIONS**

- It is proposed to develop proposals and undertake informal consultation for the reviews being undertaken in Stoughton, Park Barn and Slyfield with discussion with Local Ward and Divisional members and then with residents and others affected by proposals. In the case of Slyfield Industrial Estate, initially discussions will be held with the Industrial Estate Manager and ward and divisional members and then a wider consultation with those affected.
- The ad-hoc issues, which are prioritised sufficiently highly for them to be considered during the current review, are likely to require the introduction of one-off measures, rather than a whole raft of controls. Therefore, the need for more involved consultation is not necessary. However, if the scoring system is agreed by Committee further proposals will be brought forward concerning which locations to action and how to proceed.

#### FINANCIAL AND VALUE FOR MONEY IMPLICATIONS

- The cost of consolidating the Non-Guildford Town Centre Controlled Parking Zone and Parished Areas orders is estimated to be in the region of £6,000. This cost to be funded from the CPZ on-street account.
- With officers undertaking the consultation and design the costs are already covered in the salaries budget.

#### **EQUALITIES AND DIVERSITY IMPLICATIONS**

Reviewing the need for the introduction of formalised disabled bays on an annual basis, and regardless of locality, will improve accessibility for blue badge holders. Otherwise, there are no equality or diversity implications.

#### CRIME AND DISORDER IMPLICATIONS

There are no crime and disorder implications.

#### **CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

If significant issues arise as a result of the informal consultation, that these, and the ad-hoc proposals, are reported back to a future meeting of the committee for further consideration.

#### REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

The proposed controls will ensure easier traffic flow, particularly around junctions and promote a better balance in the use of kerbside space.

#### WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

Proposals and a consultation programme for selected locations will be developed. A desktop survey will be conducted of the 140 locations listed in **ANNEXE 2** and a further report will be brought to Committee to recommend which should be actioned.

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


