# KEY ISSUE

This report documents progress on the Minor Improvements programme over the past year and recommends a number of newly identified schemes for addition to the programme as recommended by the Committee's Transportation Task Group.

### **SUMMARY**

The Transportation Task Group met on 3 September 2009 to consider new requests for minor improvements and to review the existing minor highway improvements programme. The recommendations of the Task Group are set out in the report.

This report is the first of three covering the Committee's improvements programme, and should be read in conjunction with Items 13 and 14 on this agenda.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee is asked to agree:

- (i) that the progress made in delivering the minor improvements programme since last year be noted, including the completed projects set out in **ANNEXE A**.
- (ii) that the list of schemes remaining in the forward programme as set out in **ANNEXE B** be noted.
- (iii) that the recommendations of the Transportation Task Group regarding new schemes put forward since last year be approved as set out in **ANNEXE C**, supported by the detail in **ANNEXE D**.
- (iv) that officers be authorised to proceed with any necessary actions including traffic orders, advertisements and notices of intent in order to deliver these projects as soon as 2010/11 budgets are known.

### PROGRESS DURING 2008/2009

- 1 **ANNEXE A** sets out details of those schemes on which progress has been made since April 2009, funded from the 2009/10 LTP settlement.
- 2 **ANNEXE B** lists those schemes remaining in the forward programme, as yet unfunded, on which no work has yet been carried out. These are not listed in any order of priority.

### NEW REQUESTS FOR SCHEMES TO BE ADDED TO THE PROGRAMME

- 3 The Transportation Task Group met on the 3 September 2009 to review progress achieved on existing Minor Improvement Schemes and to consider new requests put forward since last year.
- During the last year, 4 potential new improvements were identified by Officers, Members, Parish Councils and residents. The Transportation Task Group received a detailed presentation on each of these, including an assessment by officers of the opportunity each scheme provided to meet the needs of local communities and the Local Transport Plan (LTP) objectives. These schemes and the Officer and Task Group recommendations are shown in **ANNEXE C**. **ANNEXE D** also shows the detailed assessment considered by the Task Group for each such request. The Task Group resolved that the two schemes where personal injury collisions had occurred should be recommended for inclusion in the forward programme, while the other two, where there have been no injury collisions, should not.

### FINANCIAL AND VALUE FOR MONEY IMPLICATIONS

5 This report has no immediate financial implications. The report at Item 14 on this agenda covers the five-year minor schemes programme.
