- Following agreement of the distribution of the Highway Maintenance and Revenue Budgets at the Executive on 3rd March 2003, this report sets out the suggested way forward for management of the Maintenance Budgets for Mole Valley Local Transportation Service for 2003/4. The indicative functional distribution of the Highways Maintenance Revenue Budget is prepared on the basis of the needs patterns of previous years and current priorities. Details of the Capital Maintenance schemes that have been allocated funding for 2003/4 are set out in this report, following the bidding process that took place in December 2002. Members are requested to note and agree the funding available for maintenance schemes in Mole Valley in 2003/4.

- This report details how the transportation capital budget for 2003/04 could be utilised following the LTP report that was presented to this Committee in December 2002. That report outlined an indicative programme of works. A bid to secure funds for integrated transport measures has been made and the total amount of funds available for the District of Mole Valley for the 2003/04 financial year is £600,000. Members may also wish to allocate the County Capital Local Allocation of £100,000 (approx) to highways and transportation schemes. Members are requested to agree the priority order of Local Transport Plan (LTP) schemes and projects and to agree the allocation of funds accordingly for 2003/04.

The proposed works extend between Copthorne Road and Dilston Road.
