What will be done?

Description

Brockham Youth Council is a community youth group aimed at young people 11-18yrs, living in Brockham, Betchworth, Buckland & Leigh. The group is made up of volunteers, both adults & young people and our aims are very simple:

- Find out what the young people want to do for social, sport & recreation
- Track down the funding needed
- Organise the activities the young people want

The idea is to provide what the young people say they want to do, not what adults think they should want or do.

The group is building on information that came out of Brockham's Parish Plan that identified that provision of activities for young people needed to be improved and that young people needed to feel included in the wider community. We have carried out a lot of research and consultation with young people to identify and prioritise all the activities they want to see happen and this now comprises a long and wide-ranging list!

An art club where they got to choose the sort of art they tried and was project based has been identified by young people as something they would like to do. They felt that there is lots of this sort of activity for younger children and they would like to be able to have access to doing art that they had chosen to do. It would help those studying art at GCSE and A-level, could help with Duke of Edinburgh skill awards and would just be good fun.

We have found a local art teacher willing to run weekly term-time sessions and a suitable venue and we are currently building up a waiting list of those interested in taking part.

The Difference It Will Make

Activities for young people aged 11-18yrs, based in the village, are important as it allows young people from all parts of the village, from different schools and of different ages to meet and socialise.

Taking part in art activity is relaxing and an important creative stimulus that young people sometimes miss out on if they have not chosen to study art at GCSE or if they do not have access to art materials at home. It can also be very helpful to those who are not academically driven.

By allowing the young people to chose what they want to try out we think there

will be some very interesting results and we hope to have an art exhibition at the end of the first year. A local business has offered to donate prizes if we organise this.

We believe there will also be benefits to the local community. By organising local activities the wider community have interaction with young people and the local venues are in use, therefore increasing their revenue and sustainability. By doing an art exhibition, the wider community can also get involved and interested in the project.

Description of the project. What difference will this make?	We are seeking start-up funding for a Fishing Club to provide leisure activity and teach skills to 'at risk' young people in North Leatherhead. We believe that learning skills is an important activity for young people who are facing challenges in their lives and is a very effective tool for building self esteem. We will start a fishing club which provides young people who are at-risk of exclusion with regular fishing trips with support from mentors and volunteers. The		

	young people, in groups of between 4-6, will learn how to maintain equipment as well as getting to grips with fishing skills. In year 1 of the project we will work with 6 young people who are identified by our team as 'at risk' either because of difficulty at school or a situation at home. Referrals will be sought from Therfield School and other local youth workers. The project will aim to support each young person with clear outcomes using the 'Outcome Star' monitoring system. The young people involved will take part in two team building sessions where they learn the basics of team-work as well as how to use fishing equipment, before taking part in 4 day trips across the summer months (May-September). We believe this project will give confidence and hope to young people who are otherwise struggling for inspiration and support. We also believe that the skills they learn through this project will give them confidence and purpose to continue this hobby into the future. The costs involved in this bid include purchase of equipment, license costs and transportation. Fishing will take place in Mole Valley, at the Bury Hill lake in Dorking.

Summary

The principle of Young Farmers is that the members run their own clubs, of which there are 7 across Surrey, and also the county federation. This enables members to develop key life skills. To kick start and accelerate this development we run an Annual Development programme. This includes a series of events such as Junior and Senior development weekends, Competitions Days, and Club and County Officer training.

Through these actual overall skills such as team work, planning and organising and leadership are gained. Other specific skills such as crafts, cooking, public reading/speaking, and self presentation in an interview situation are also gained. In addition our members develop a sense of achievement, feel valued, enjoy contributing and participating and take responsibility for themselves.

Team building games e.g. sitting circle, pyramid

What will be done?

Currently we are seeking funding for: -

New Music

Our Youth Orchestra is in need of new music to play and perform. The children like to perform modern classics from film & TV scores like 'Pirates of the Caribbean' and 'Dr Who' as well as classical pieces. The Orchestra needs to continually update the library to keep the interest and enthusiasm of the children.

New portable Music Stands

Our current portable music stands are very old and battered. On a health and safety basis we have had to throw away quite a number and they need replacing urgently. At the rate the stands are failing we will not have enough to share around very soon.

Percussion instruments

In September 2010 we started up a percussion section for our Youth Orchestra. It has been many years since we had one. We do have some percussion instruments, left over from years past, but we need to add to these especially as our percussion section is growing healthily.

Concert Uniforms

Our current concert uniform – which has been on the go for at least 15 years - consists of a mustard yellow tie, which the children wear with their school uniform – white shirt/black trousers/skirt. Over the past few years the children have begun to 'mutiny' as they no longer feel the uniform is 'modern' or 'in fashion'. We have to agree with them and would dearly love to modernise the uniform. We are currently getting their design ideas in for this. Uniforms are a very costly business these days and funding towards this would be a huge help. It would be great to be able to have this in place in time for our summer concert on Wednesday 4th July 2012.

Weekly Rehearsal t-shirts/polo shirts

We would very much like to introduce a t-shirt or polo shirt for our regular weekly rehearsals for the children. This we feel would increase a sense of belonging and camaraderie amongst them.

Advertising Campaign Costs

To increase our membership we currently need funding to print flyers to distribute through schools – most schools also now ask for a donation for this... libraries; shop windows; etc. We also need to advertise in local papers and magazines on a continuing basis. We need funding to be able to display our advertising banner at different venues around the area.

Coach travel to residential home concerts

In February of this year Encore, by invitation, also performed for the residents at the Royal Star and Garter Home in Richmond, Surrey. We were very well received. They would very much like us to perform for them again next year.

We would like the EYC to perform further concerts per year to other such residential homes/charity events across Surrey.

Unfortunately parents are not always prepared to take their children to performance venues out of their local area. To ensure we have a full contingent we need to travel by coach, which is a costly exercise. E.g. The coach for the Royal Star and Garter Home cost £270 for the afternoon.

Bring in Professional Musicians for one or two day workshops

We would like to bring in professional musicians to run workshops for the children. We feel the outside influences would stimulate and enthuse the children and encourage and strengthen their musical abilities both as a group and individually. It will also further their opportunities of things to do at the weekend and during the holidays.

Difference this will make to the Orchestra

In Sept 2008 when I took over as the Chair, our Orchestra was at an all time low membership wise. We only had approximately 13 members. When my children had joined two years earlier there were around 32 members. At its height in the 1990s there had been 70 members.

With the help of a new Committee we set about raising the orchestra from the ashes – hence the name 'Phoenix Project'. We changed the name from Encore Schools Orchestra to Encore **Youth** Orchestra. We set in motion a large advertising campaign for the local area and fundraising to cover this. One of the aims of our first three-year development plan was to bring the Orchestra back up to at least 35 members. We have achieved this. We have also managed to start a percussion section so we have a full orchestra contingent.

We are now entering the next phase of the project, which means implementing the essential wish list above for which we need help with funding. This will further strengthen Encore Youth Orchestra so the current children will want to stay and bring in their friends. Our reputation will grow further so more children and their families get to hear about us. The aim now is to increase our membership to 45 by the end of the academic year 2012/2013.

Difference this will make to the local community in Surrey.

Our ethos is that we are a non-profit making youth orchestra, dedicated to developing a love of music in young people and nurturing a wide range of musical abilities and talent. If we keep to our current membership numbers from September 2012 and get outside funding we will be able to offer disadvantaged children the chance to join on a low cost or no subscription basis and loan them an instrument to practice on if necessary. A further aspiration, if we can get enough funding to cover it, would be to be able to offer scholarships to these children of outside individual music lessons.

As well as our Spring and Summer Concerts – which are open to the local community - twice yearly our Youth Orchestra members perform to residents at our local community retirement homes. With further funding we can increase these to include residential homes/charity events further afield in Surrey as well (see above under heading Coach travel to residential home concerts).

Description of the project. What difference will this make?	We started two years ago Ashtead mini colts, which is basically a football club for 4 - 6 year olds to learn the basics of football. This started with 6 players in September 2010 and today we have 92, so you can see the demand is huge and the feedback has been so positive. I have run this solely by myself as a voluntary scheme ever Saturday morning over four hours each week and now I have to move onto other areas, but would like this our Under 16/17 and 18 players can take this venture on under my and other higher qualified supervision. We would need to the youngsters all CRB checked, put through FA level one coaching courses and ideal have 10 youth players teach what they have learned over the years from other coaches to then pass this onto real youngsters on their first steps of the football ladder.
