#### 1. ADDITIONAL REVENUE BIDS

#### **EXCITING SCIENCE – SETPOINT SURREY**

Member Amount Proposed Summary of Proposal

Funding is sought as a contribution to the provision of Exciting Science days for primary pupils at schools within the Redhill division. Most primary school teachers are not familiar with the scientific concepts which support modern engineering and technology, and may lack the knowledge, confidence and equipment to run a Key Stage 2 Science and Technology Day. Setpoint Surrey has over ten years' experience of providing exciting science in primary classrooms by organising one-or two-day events.

## DESIGN OF PEDESTRIAN ISLAND – JUNCTION OF ALEXANDER ROAD AND PRICES LANE, WOODHATCH

Funding is sought as a contribution towards the costs of designing a pedestrian island and associated measures within the headway of Alexander Road at the junction with Prices Lane. A pedestrian island will assist those wishing to cross the road and help calm traffic movements. This is of particular value given the proximity of Orchards School and nearby homes for the elderly.

#### WOODHATCH CHRISTMAS TREE

Funding is sought for the supply and planting of a permanent Christmas tree at the Woodhatch crossroads. This will benefit the local community, and consultation has taken place with Reigate and Banstead Borough Council and local traders.

## HOOLEY CLUB AND CHIPSTEAD ENHANCEMENT PROJECT – AGE CONCERN MERSTHAM, REDHILL AND REIGATE

#### Member Amount Proposed Summary of Proposal

Mrs Angela Fraser £2,500

Funding is sought to contribute towards the running of the Hooley Club, social outings and trips. The club has had a large reduction in numbers, making it difficult to subsidise the cost of running the club, social outings and trips to places of interest from the fund intake from current members. The funding would enable the club to extend its membership to the Chipstead area, and provide social outings and trips at little or no cost to the members. This will help to address the

needs of elderly people by preventing isolation and loneliness and providing the opportunity to meet new people and make friends.

#### **REFURBISHMENT OF RIDDEL HALL, WALTON ON THE HILL**

Funding is sought to refit the kitchen, resurface the floor and address health and safety concerns, so that the hall can be used by the local community as extensively in the coming years as in the last one hundred. Consultation has taken place with the Chairman of Trustees and residents of Walton on the Hill.

#### **BANSTEAD YOUTH CENTRE – CARPET AND CHAIRS**

Funding is sought for the replacement of the carpet and purchase of chairs for the lounge room at Banstead Youth Centre. This will provide a pleasant and relaxing environment for the groups that use the centre, including the youth club, parents groups, after-school activities and holiday playschemes, benefiting young people who are at risk of anti-social behaviour, and young parents. Consultation was held with young people, local families, Banstead LCAP, local police and local schools.

#### 2. CORRECTION TO DELEGATED REVENUE BID

#### **PRESTON CHRISTMAS LIGHTS 2008**

MembersMr Michael Gosling; Mr Nick HarrisonAmount Proposed£1,000 (£500 each)Summary of Proposal

Funding was sought towards the provision of a Christmas tree, lights and a community event (school and church service/carols) at the Marbles Way shopping parade at the centre of the Preston estate. The project was jointly funded by Raven Housing Trust, with the aim of addressing community cohesion needs in this deprived area.
