1. Community orchard with wildlife meadow – Preston /	undertaken
Horley (Court Lodge) This project would involve providing a community orchard	
to both Raven and private householders in the local	
community. Community days can be set up to help prune	
the trees and pick fruit. An interpretation board would be provided on site to outline the different fruit available and	,
the wildlife that can be attracted to the area. This	
information board would be updated as the orchard	
progresses. In addition some wildlife element can be added to the site such as beetle stacks, bird and bat boxes	
etc. Raven have been successful already in providing a	
community orchard in Merstham, Surrey which has been

well received by local residents both Raven and private householders. Therefore the whole community benefits.

2. Temporary Allotment sites with gardening tool lending scheme (Site to be confirmed)

The project would involve providing an allotment site on Raven land which can be managed by the local council or managed by part time worker. The allotment site would be open to all residents both Raven and private residents in the community. Many residents are keen to garden but may not have the necessary tools or knowledge and so it is proposed to have a tool lending scheme and workshops such as composting from the local council. In addition some wildlife element can be added to the site such as beetle stacks, bird and bat boxes etc. Raven would need to identify a site and undertake a resident consultation. Raven chairs the local partnership environment group whose members include Reigate and Banstead Council. The council have fed back that allotment sites are in high demand and that they would be very interested in managing sites which were available.

3. Pond wildlife area Marbles Way Pond

Raven Housing Trust have housing in the Preston, Tadworth area. There is a large pond on the Marbles Way estate which is used by locals for fishing and has recently been dredged. This is open to the whole community both private and raven residents. Local residents may like to see the wildlife that may be attracted to the pond and therefore it is proposed that a survey should be carried out by SWT to ascertain what wildlife is in the pond (this will have to be completed in the Spring). Interpretation boards would show the types of flora and fauna found in the pond and surrounding area. Examples of wildlife attracting features (plants as well as bird feeders, bat boxes etc) would be placed on the site so the public can see the types of things they can recreate in their garden to attract wildlife. Gift vouchers for the local school could be the prizes for the best designs and a prize giving assembly could be. A team building day for staff was also discussed as a possibility to help complete some of the practical tasks.

Q5 What outcomes and outputs will you be aiming to achieve through these main functions and how do they help SCC achieve its priorities? Please also say if you are working with any SCC service and the named contact(s).

1.Community orchard with wildlife meadow – Preston / Horley (Court Lodge)

Outcomes: Raised awareness of sustainable food that can be grown on site such as apples, pears, quinces, cherries which are not bought from the local supermarket. Raised awareness of wildlife that can be attracted to the meadow. Higher resident satisfaction due to an improved local environment. Delivering the local community plan (Reigate and Banstead Council).

Outputs: A community orchard and wildlife area which will attract local wildlife and aesthetically enhance the local environment. An interpretation board to educate local residents on local wildlife and

the types of trees planted. Community days for residents to take part in pruning trees, collecting fruit.

How do they help SCC achieve its priorities: This project would support the SCC priorities as it will enhance local community leadership and engagement, raise local awareness on sustainable/local food ad wildlife and possibly link into the climate change strategy by planting more trees as we will be offsetting some carbon dioxide and be working toward improving local air quality.

2. Temporary Allotment sites with gardening tool lending scheme (Site to be confirmed).

Outcomes: Raised awareness of sustainable food that can be grown and reduce dependence on supermarket food which can have high 'food miles'. Delivering the local community plan (Reigate and Banstead Council). Resident knowledge raised on how to compost. Financially supporting residents and broadening scope of number of people who can take up food growing by providing a tool lending scheme. Reigate and Banstead borough have a long waiting list for allotments and have already shown an interest in managing a site on behalf of Raven for the local community.

Outputs: providing additional allotment sites for the local community. Tool lending scheme for those financial unable to buy their own. Supporting residents who may be on low incomes to access cheap, healthy food.

How do they help SCC achieve its priorities: This project would support the SCC priorities as it will enhance local community leadership and engagement, raise local awareness on food growing/wildlife and possibly link into the climate change strategy by offsetting some carbon dioxide as resident would be growing their own food and therefore buying less food form supermarkets, cutting down on 'food miles'.

3. Pond wildlife area Marbles Way Pond.

Outcomes: Delivering the local community plan (Reigate and Banstead Council). Raising resident's awareness of local wildlife in their area.

Outputs: Enhancing a local community facility which provides more than a fishing ground but an educational site. In addition the area would be aesthetically enhanced leading to possible higher resident satisfaction of living in their local community.

How do they help SCC achieve its priorities: This project would support the SCC priorities as it will enhance local community leadership and engagement and raise local awareness on local wildlife. It would also involve local schools to participate in a local environmental initiative.
