Through these raised gardening beds we hope to expand the children's knowledge not only of science and nature. But also their position and the effect that they have on our world.

We are sure that the children will have fun and this should enthuse them sufficiently so that they carry on with gardening at home which will also involve their parents and families.

The children will be able to appreciate the low cost, better taste and sustainability of locally grown produce.

The children will learn where our food comes from and the various costs incurred.

The children will be encouraged to design and make their own healthy meals and to appreciate the fresher and more nutritious benefits to homegrown food.

The children will also learn the benefits of home composting and the need to recycle.

This project is at a real grass roots level for encouraging children, parents and families to grow their own food; to encourage the purchase of locally grown produce and recycle waste. Thus reducing energy use and emissions for transport and minimizing resource use and the need for over packaging.

An outcome is the direct difference your project will make. The outcomes and quantifiable outputs you specify will form part of our funding agreement with you.

By talking to the children.
