Summary

The principle of Young Farmers is that the members run their own clubs, of which there are 7 across Surrey, and also the county federation. This enables members to develop key life skills. To kick start and accelerate this development we run an Annual Development programme. This includes a series of events such as Junior and Senior development weekends, Competitions Days, and Club and County Officer training.

Through these actual overall skills such as team work, planning and organising and leadership are gained. Other specific skills such as crafts, cooking, public reading/speaking, and self presentation in an interview situation are also gained. In addition our members develop a sense of achievement, feel valued, enjoy contributing and participating and take responsibility for themselves.

Junior weekend activities (ages 10-16)

Sailing, Raft building and Kayaking

Team building games e.g. sitting circle, pyramid

Volley Ball/ Rounders/Dodge ball

First aid awareness

Sign Language

All members take part in running camp, through helping organise games, being involved in the preparation of camp meals and taking their turn in general clearing/washing up duties

Older members attend as Junior Leaders and jointly lead groups with experienced leaders.

Description of the project. What difference will this make?	As new leaders we wish to re-introduce traditional patrol scouting within the sections (Beavers, Cubs, Scouts) allowing leadership skills to develop amongst the scouts, challenging their ability to work as individuals and teams, supporting and challenging each other. Part of patrol camping is recognizing that adults need to be present to facilitate effective camping, we, as a group are in serious need of a Burco water boiler which is the safest method of obtaining boiling water whilst camping. Many traditional skills are being lost, we seek to retain those skills at a safe and controlled level. Patrol scouting involves equipping the scouts to be able to camp, cook and support each other. A patrol box facilitates this, it is a box of resources that can be used and cared for by patrols, so they can learn about caring for equipment as well as using it safely. The beauty of investing in a good patrol box is that it can have a life span of over 10 years. All adult help and time is given voluntarily. We plan to run our first full	

	patrol filed camp in traditional style in August. We have been donated a field to use to camp in. Many of the skills that will be learnt by the Children are being lost and replaced by 'activity' camps which do not involve traditional bushcraft skills, new camps have modern activities such as 'go-karting in pre made plastic go-karts' rather than the more traditional go-karts hand made in patrols by the scouts. How to use knives safely is rarely taught now by organisations, yet is a skill for life. Chainsaws have replaced axes, yet safe axe use used to be taught. Children cooking over open fires in groups, supporting and helping each other. We aim to bring back these traditions.
