<p>Q4 Describe the project or activities you are seeking funding for Thorpe School has an outdoor swimming pool used for school lessons and by the community for nursery age children, a neighbouring school and after school club. This year it intends to extend this to the residents with aqua aerobic classes outside school hours. The primary heating of the pool is by electricity and this has high CO2 impacts. A solar thermal system would displace this reliance on electricity. This project is to supply solar panels to heat the pool and conserve energy costs</p>	<p>Briefly describe the proposed actions and the activities that will be undertaken</p>

<p>Q5 What outcomes and outputs will you be aiming to achieve through these main functions and how do they help SCC achieve its priorities? Please also say if you are working with any SCC service and the named contact(s).</p> <p>The use of renewable energy will reduce carbon and contribute to the SCC Climate Change Strategy.</p> <p>For the school it will have considerable financial savings from their energy budget. This saving can then be used to enhance the school budget for other requirements.</p>	<p>An outcome is the direct difference your project will make. The outcomes and quantifiable outputs you specify will form part of our funding agreement with you.</p>
<p>Q6 How will you measure your success in carrying out the activities and achieving the outcomes you have set out above?</p> <p>Reduced consumption can be easily measured.</p> <p>The school has already achieved the first two stages of the Eco schools award and this will help it achieve a "Green Flag".</p>	<p>We don't want to create reporting burdens so do keep systems simple, realistic and informative. If you measure your success for other funders - could some of that information be used by us too?</p>

It would hope to have this installed for the 2010 season.</p>	<p>We will be requiring a brief quarterly update on progress and these milestones will form the basis of that update</p>

A recent meeting was held with local stakeholders to develop the school development plan and the progress of the eco schools award was considered a priority.</p> <p>This project would involve the school management team, the Governors and it’s advisors, the Friends of Thorpe School.</p> <p><i>After installation the school would seek to offer this project as an example for other schools to visit and learn from.</i></p>	<p>Please list the partner organisations you are working with and their involvement in the project.</p>
