

STRATEGIC AIM 1: PARTICIPATION AND ENGAGEMENT

To improve access and participation in education and training (14 – 19) in Runnymede

- a) Increase the range and availability of high quality vocational and applied learning qualifications at 14 19, which are increasingly accessed by students.
- b) Improve the success and satisfaction rates of students studying vocational and applied learning courses.
- c) Work with other 14- 19 networks to ensure that students are able to access their entitlement of all 17 diploma lines by 2013.
- d) Identify, monitor and provide targeted support for students at risk of becoming NEET.
- e) Develop and system for capturing learner voice within the Runnymede Network.
- f) Reduce the number of students receiving fixed term and permanent exclusions through network exclusion support and SALP.
- g) Ensure that Runnymede students who are best suited to Foundation Learning, have access to a suitable range of high quality courses that meet their needs.
- h) Support and develop strategies to improve participation for young people from vulnerable groups including Children in Care and those with specific needs.



STRATEGIC AIM 2: ACHIEVEMENT AND ATTAINMENT

To improve learner achievement and attainment (14 – 19) in Runnymede

- a) Monitor and improve achievement and attainment at key stage 4 and provide appropriate support and challenge.
- b) Monitor and improve achievement and attainment at post 16 in schools, colleges and work based learning providers.



STRATEGIC AIM 3: Progression

To improve the proportion of Year 11 learners who progress (L1, L2 and Level 3) by the age of 19.

- a) Develop clear learning pathways for students.
- b) Ensure students have access to high quality and impartial information, advice and guidance.
- c) Systematically track and analyse learner destinations at 16, 17 and 18 and meet the September Guarantee.
- d) Increase awareness of the Area Prospectus.
- e) Provide support for the effective use of individual learning plans across Runnymede.
- f) Support the Aim Higher programme to increase the percentage of learners in Runnymede progressing to Higher Education.
- g) Work with HEI's to identify appropriate progression routes for diploma students.

To improve collaborative working through effective leadership and management structures in Runnymede

- a) Working with the Runnymede Business Partnership and employers to improve employer engagement to make links between the curriculum and the workplace.

- c) Provide sufficient training and CPD opportunities for staff across the Runnymede Network.
- d) Ensure there are effective collaborative groups that seek to provide further opportunities for students across the network.
- e) Ensure that there is an effective tracking system in place to monitor, support and challenge students appropriately.
