<u>SECTION FIVE – LOCAL SERVICE REQUIREMENT</u>

Within Runnymede the likelihood of a young person becoming NEET or entering the youth justice system is correlated with young people who have one or more of these predictive risk factors:

- School attendance less than 80%
- Excluded from school
- Engaged in anti social behaviour
- Statement of Special Education Need or on school action/school action plus

Levels of NEET and FTE are generally low in Surrey. Data presented at the Needs Assessment workshop on 05/10/11 is shown in the table. The proportion of NEET in Runnymede is 7.93%, and FTE is 6.69%, whereas the proportion of the population is 6.96% of all Surrey young people.

The workshop identified broad areas of concern such as poverty, transport, lack of parental support, not enough careers advice and learning disabilities. There was agreement on the geographical areas presenting with the highest levels of need – these areas are Englefield Green, Egham Hythe/Pooley Green, Chertsey and Addlestone.

The recommendations of the Task Group were:

- a) That the local prevention framework priority for Runnymede is to prevent NEET and FTEs across the borough of Runnymede. The Task Group proposes to assign the resource for prevention of young people becoming NEET or first time entrants to the youth justice system, in proportion to the current percentage of young people who are NEET and/or first time entrants to the youth justice system. This is a ratio of 51:38 (numbers) or NEET 57% and youth justice entrants 43% (as a percentage).
- b) That in terms of geographical reach, the Task Group agreed their preferred option as a whole district approach but drawing the provider's attention to the particular areas of need in Englefield Green, Egham Hythe/Pooley Green, Chertsey and Addlestone.

There are four County Council youth centres in Runnymede (Addlestone Youth Centre, Egham Youth Centre, Englefield Green Youth Centre and Gogmore Park Farm).

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RONI (Risk of NEET Indicator) Data for Runnymede

Definition of when a young person is identified as at risk of becoming NEET. Based on the analysis we have completed, the following definition of at risk of becoming NEET has been agreed:

'Young people in Surrey Schools who have one or more primary risk factors, or three or more secondary risk factors.'

Final list of NEET risk factors employed in RONI

Primary factors:

- Looked After by Surrey County Council
- Young offender
- Permanent exclusion from school
- Attendance of less than 80%

Secondary factors:

- School Action Plus, Special Educational Needs Statement and School Action
- Fixed Term Exclusion from School
- Eligible for Free School Meals
- English as an additional language
- Did not achieve level 4 in English and Maths at Key Stage 2
- Lives in an area in the top 30% of the Income Deprivation Affecting Children Indices (IDACI)
- A member of the Gypsy, Roma and Traveller community
