SPELTHORNE TRANSPORTATION AREA LOCAL TRANSPORTATION PROGRAMME BID 2006/07 TO 2011/12

20 MARCH 2006

KEY ISSUE:

This report shows the proposed Local Transport Plan forward programme bid for the years 2006/07 to 2011/12. The LTP funding bid is based on indicative funding levels.

OFFICER RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Committee is asked to agree that:

- (i) the LTP programme bid for the year 2006/7 is approved; and
- (ii) the LTP programmes and indicative bids for LTP 2 for

the years 2007/08 to 2011/12 are approved in principle.

1. INTRODUCTION and BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The financial and scheme bidding process is an essential part of the LTP procedure, used to ensure adequate funding to achieve the programmes set out in 2.2 below.
- 1.2 The LTP programme is continually reviewed to ensure a flexible and equitable approach to the needs of the community within the objectives of the LTP.
- 1.3 Spelthorne's allocation for Local Transport Plan schemes during the 2005/06 financial year was initially £510,000 but was later reduced to £420,000 as reported to Committee 21 February 2005. This funding level has remained for 2006/07.
- 1.4 Members will recall that at the December meeting of their Committee it was resolved that the intermediate scheme for Clockhouse Lane, Ashford should be submitted for 2008/9.
- 1.5 The bid for 2006/07 is the first year of LTP 2. It also covers the programme and bid for the 5 year period 2007/08 to 2011/12.

The method of recording the forward programme includes three schedules as detailed below:

- **Schedule A** Construction Programme for the current financial year.
- **Schedule B** Outline design / Consultation / Committee Approval (for construction 2006/07) and

2. ANALYSIS AND COMMENTARY

- 2.1 The LTP objectives are set out below:
 - Integration to improve co-ordination between all forms of transport, and to integrate transport with other policies.
 - Environment to protect and improve the environment of Surrey and health of its people by reducing the adverse effects of motorised transport.
 - Safety to improve safety and security of transport for all travellers.

- Economy to promote an efficient transport system which supports a sustainable economy.
- Accessibility to make it easier for everyone to travel to everyday facilities, especially people without a car.

There are also shared priorities identified for LTP 2:

- Congestion
- Accessibility
- Environmental Impact and Quality of Life
- Road Safety
- 2.2 The programme bid is based on the ability of the Spelthorne Local Transportation Service to meet and deliver realistic targets for the years 2006/07 to 2011/12. The bid is shown as follows:

3. CONSULTATIONS

- 3.1 Consultation will form part of the implementation process for the schemes contained within Schedule A (Construction Programme) & B (Outline design / Consultation / Committee Approval (for construction next financial year or later). However, as part of the LTP 2 bid, extensive consultation has taken place with residents, local businesses, Spelthorne Borough Council and the Local Strategic Partnership. During the summer of 2004 over 650 people attended exhibitions and workshops. Exhibitions were held again around the district last summer. The general views expressed concluded that the four main drivers for the area should be as follows:
 - A) Safe Routes to Schools programme
 - B) Improvements to bus stop infrastructure and need for Real Time Information
 - C) Casualty Reduction
 - D) Tackling congestion and speeding

These priorities support the shared priorities set out in 2.1 above.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The financial implications will be set out in the LTP bid following agreement of the bid proposals by this Committee.

5. SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT IMPLICATIONS

5.1 Surrey has embraced the concept of sustainable development which is the foundation of Surrey's Local Transport Plan and is committed to the vision of making Surrey a better place. Funding from this integrated transport budget will be expended on projects and schemes in line with this vision whilst fulfilling its key commitments.
