

# OFFICER REPORT TO LOCAL COMMITTEE (Spelthorne)

## £70,000 capital budget for highways 2010 / 2011

## 21 September 2010

## **KEY ISSUE**

To seek approval for expenditure of a £70,000 capital budget for highways in Spelthorne in the 2010 / 2011 financial year.

#### **SUMMARY**

The Leader of Surrey County Council on 20 July 2010 announced £1m extra funding for the council's roads. He stated that each of the 11 local committees would be asked how and where the money should be spent. The budget available to the Spelthorne Local Committee is £70,000. It is important that proposals are agreed for expenditure on schemes that can be implemented during the current financial year. This reports sets out two options for expenditure of the £70,000.

## OFFICER RECOMMENDATIONS

## The Local Committee (Spelthorne) is asked to:

(i) approve use of the £70,000 capital funds for Spelthorne as set out in paragraph 3.2 for Option 1 or Option 2.

#### 1 INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Leader of the Surrey County Council made a verbal statement at the meeting of the Council on 20 July, in which he announced £1m extra funding for the council's roads. He stated that each of the 11 local committees would be asked how and where the money should be spent.
- 1.2 The Leader asked that the money be allocated based on a formula looking at total road length and population. The amount for each committee is set out below, with Spelthorne receiving £70,000.

## 2 ANALYSIS

- 2.1 The £70,000 is capital funding. It could be used for Integrated Transport schemes, parking schemes, carriageway surfacing schemes, footway schemes and drainage schemes. The funding should not be used for revenue items, however the Local Committee has already allocated funds for tree and footway works and to jointly fund with the London Borough of Hounslow the design of Clockhouse Lane pedestrian / cycle bridge.
- 2.2 The Head of Surrey Highways wrote to members of the Local Committee setting out some suggestions for utilising the funds during the current financial year however there is a proposal to allocate this funding equally across the Divisions. To ensure schemes can be implemented speedily design work needs to be minimal so funds could be allocated to integrated transport schemes where the design work is complete, carriageway patching or footway improvements.
- 2.3 Patching schemes that have been priced for Spelthorne would all cost over £10,000 and the only integrated transport schemes that have already been designed are drainage works to A308 Kingston Road and a revised roadmarking layout for Sunbury Cross Roundabout.

## 3 OPTIONS

- 3.1 Some Members have suggested some local priorities for the funding and two options are set out below. Schemes of carriageway patching and footway improvements are generally more achievable within the time constraints than integrated transport schemes that require detailed design. work.
- 3.2 Two proposed options are set out below:
