Spelthorne District Scouts has delivered a healthy mix of taster sessions and more focused achievement based training to a wide range of cub and scout groups over the years. Beaver scout and guide activities have also been supported. This was given a boost through a previous similar grant in 2007, mainly targeted at the smaller paddler previously not provided for. The currently delivered program is let down by the ageing equipment for the mid to large sized youth paddler. The kayaks currently used for this key youth range are either old heavy straight line boats that prove frustrating when learning maneuvering skills and playing games, or are difficult for a beginner to track in a straight line when paddling any distance. Having to work round these limitations detracts from the paddling experience.

The grant will fund new kayaks and paddles for the mid to larger sized youths. The type of kayak identified is a fusion between kayaks designed for maneuverability when learning skills, playing games and playing in water features and straight line stability when touring. This is achieved through boat shape, new materials and a skeg that can be lowered and raised. These kayaks will make the first time experience more fun for groups on taster sessions and enable a wider choice of trips for those advancing their skills.

Another feature of the kayaks is a water tight storage area which

serves to further enable journeying but also improves the bouyancy of inevitably capsized vessels, speeding up the recovery process and thus reducing risks.

The paddles being sought will replace aged, failing wooden paddles. They also take advantage of modern design and materials, with the younger paddler benefiting from lighter materials and smaller paddle grip diameters, reducing fatigue.

The type of kayak being targeted have typical online prices of between £470 and £540 each. The paddles are typically between £32 and £54. With bulk purchase it is anticipated that 9 or 10 complete sets can be purchased, compromises being made depending on what deals can be made and the amount of grant awarded. To further address the aging/failing paddle issue, any remaining money after kayak/paddle set purchases will purchase further paddles to help with the remaining older kayaks.

Description of the project. What difference will this make?	financial support is requested in this application need the opportunity to meet together in a safe and secure environment for a 10 week programme of outdoor sporting and group activities as part of the annual programme of our Boys' Brigade Company. The young people benefiting from this programme are members of The Boys' Brigade – this programme has historically been very successful in recruiting new members, offering a structured place for young people to go. Throughout the year, the members will work towards The Boys' Brigade's "Discover" award scheme. The ten week programme for which we are seeking support will include a range of outdoor sporting activities, football, softball, basketball, cricket, hockey, athletics, volley ball etc as well as outings for swimming, golf driving range, canoeing and the like. The young people are involved in the preparation of the programme, identifying the types of event they would like to undertake. Success of the programme is demonstrated by the individuals desire to attend week by week and contribute positively and offer constructive feedback on the activities offered. Involvement in the preparation & planning of the programme counts towards leadership elements of "Discover" in addition to the more obvious physical benefit. The young people are predominantly members of The Boys' Brigade, however in addition a number of new members are attracted by the programme on offer. Youth workers are the pre existing

volunteers who support the work of our BB Company on a week by week basis. Sporting equipment is already available and in the ownership of The Boys' Brigade. The work proposed in this application will follow a tried and tested approach including a weekly outdoor meeting at a consistent time and place. Attendance by the young people is recorded on a week by week basis, with contact made with those who do not attend for more than two consecutive weeks – the success of the programme offered is very well gauged by the number of young people who participate. Those young people who participate in the Summer activities programme and find it enjoyable are more likely to return to the Boys' Brigade for the indoor winter session at the end of the Summer Holiday period. The Boys' Brigade's own award scheme "Discover" is used to provide a structure to the annual programme of work undertaken. For us to be able to deliver this programme we need suitable outdoor facilities with the opportunity to move inside in the event of wet weather. We have developed a good working relationship with the Spelthorne School over many years and have successfully used their premises. Any grant awarded under this application will be used specifically to meet the costs of the school premises.

Description of the project. What difference will this make?	The North Surrey Group Camp offers an annual week long residential event for members of the Boys' Brigade in Spelthorne & Runnymede. Typically the young people who attend are at both ends of the economic, social and educational spectrum - when together at Camp their differences are irrelevant as they live and work together learning as they go, the needs of one another, how to get the best from each other and how to gain mutual benefit by working together. More senior members benefit from the opportunity of taking on leadership responsibility both by being involved in the preparation for the Camp and at the event itself by undertaking tasks to ensure and maintain the smooth and safe running of Camp. The organisation and structure of the Camp are tried and tested, this does not mean we are closed to new ideas and ways of working – a critical evaluation of the event takes place within a month of returning from Camp each year. Accumulated experience and a series of planning meetings supports us in the preparation of the Camp each year. At age 16 the young people are invited to become involved in the planning of the event and encouraged to voice their opinion in how the event should be planned, managed and run. Similarly, these folk are encourgaged to particiapte in the review following the Camp each year. The young people are members of the BB groups based in Spelthorne & Runnymede, the leadership of the Camp is undertaken by the volunteer leaders of the home Companies. Venues for the event are selected from a number that are established by BB

groups around the country – we buy in the resource of a camp site, generally these are selected for their level of equipment & accommodation, nearby activities or activity providers and cost. The Group Camp owns a selection of camping, catering and sporting equipment vital to supplement the resources found at many of the Campsites we choose. This equipment is stored in a rented garage which is part of the focus of this application. The front line youth work undertaken by The North Surrey Group Camp takes place during a single week of the year, progress is reviewed on a day by day basis with the programme modified to accommodate the needs of the young people in addition to any restricions imposed by location or weather. Feedback is sought from the young people and their families following the event. It is very difficult to specifically monitor and evaluate the work that goes on at camp, however the change in the young people is often evident from the day they arrive at camp to the day they leave. By being given leadership opportunities as tent commanders the older boys learn practically, skills of being a team leader. Through encouragement of the leaders, & the other boys, those who are home sick or uncomfortable – often as a result of being away from home for the first time – quickly settle in and adapt to the independence of being away from home. Support is being sought to cover the cost of the equipment store and to allow our equipment to be supplemented with 3 Trangia stoves. The annual rent on our equipment storage garage is necessary as our member companies do not have their own premises and it is not possible for their host Churches to accommodate the equipment that is stored at "The Camp Garage" Trangia stoves will allow the young people to prepare hot drinks and small meals for themselves as part of our activity programme at the coming event at Dartmoor. In spite of our desire to keep the all inclusive Camp fee at less than £100 this has been impossible over recent years due to the increases in the cost of food & fuel. We like to be able to include in the Camp Fee calculation only those items for which the young people will derive a tangible benefit – food, transport, somewhere to sleep, something to do etc.

Every Friday between 20th July – 31st August CORE Youth we will be running activities for the local young people in and around Chertsey. These Friday nights will consist of fun games, creating an environment for friendships to be created and built. We also encourage young people to get involved in running these nights by coming along to our planning meetings. They come up with ideas for games & teenage topics they want to hear spoken on.

In all of these projects our aim is to achieve our stated goals above.

About Us

CORE Youth is an extended community project of Chertsey Hub, which revived the Youth Centre that was closed for 10 years due to government cut backs. The initial project was funded by volunteers and in cooperation with the local police and the SCC.
