SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL'S LOCAL COMMITTEE IN SURREY HEATH

18th March 2004

KEY ISSUE: To update Members on this years Allocations and to finalise funding allocations for this financial year.

OFFICER RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Surrey Heath Local Committee:

- 1. notes the monitoring statement attached, and
- 2. approves the allocations made from the pooled budget, and
- 3. approves the allocations made by Maurice Neighbour and Lavinia Sealy.

INTRODUCTION and BACKGROUND

- 1. The agreed criteria are that:
- The project is legal and is able to show a clear audit trail.
- The project will be completed **before** the end of the financial year.
- The funding needed is a "one-off".
- The funding will support the priorities of the Surrey County Council Corporate Plan, the Surrey Heath insert of the Corporate Plan or the Surrey Heath Community Strategy. (See below)
- The project will give long-term benefit.
- The project will be preventative in nature.
- The project will be of benefit to the wider community
- The project targets disadvantaged areas or groups.
- Surrey County Council funding will unlock more funding opportunities.
- 2. Surrey County Council's Corporate Plan lists the main challenges to be met under the key areas of:
 - Making Surrey a better place to learn and develop.
 - Making Surrey a better place to live and do business.
 - Making Surrey a better place to travel.
 - Making Surrey a better place where vulnerable people are more independent.
 - Making Surrey a better place where people feel safe.
 - Making Surrey a better place where everybody matters.

- 3. The Surrey Heath insert of the Corporate Plan lists projects that will be progressed in 2003 / 2004. The last point in this list is "We will fund projects that will benefit the Community"
- 4. The key issues identified by the Surrey Heath Local Strategic Partnership are:
 - Health
 - Housing and Employment
 - Transport
 - Safety
 - Community Support
 - Education
- 5. Members will have received a report entitled "Mid-Term review The Way Forward". This suggested that for the next two years County Council priorities should be:
 - Improving the local street scene.
 - Working with Young People to develop facilities for them.
 - Making every pound count, and keeping the Council Tax rises as low as possible.
 - Demonstrating we are able to be both truly local, and big enough to handle the major issues, standing up for Surrey's residents.
 - Ensuring that people know what we are doing.
- 6. In order to ensure that funding can be allocated and used within this financial year it is extremely important that Members decided on allocations at this meeting. This is the last opportunity to allocate funds.

POOLED ALLOCATIONS

- 8. The Committee has £17,850 per Member in 2002/03. Members decided on 24th April 2003 to allocate £10,000 each into a pooled sum, so that it could be used to focus on key County Council priorities in the Borough. There is £13,600 left in the pooled allocation.
- 9. The Surrey Heath Youth Council will be unable to allocate funds this year. However, they have requested financial support of £1,000 for their Valentine's Disco that was held in February. The event was for 16 18

- year olds and promoted the activities and membership of the Youth Council. The Youth Council would like to explore ways of allocating funds in 2004/05 and Jane Biscombe will be attending a meeting in April to discuss the plans that the SHYC have for 2004/05.
- 10. Lightwater Pre-school have requested support for their expansion to a second site to continue to provide pre-school activities for children in Lightwater. A funding allocation of £1,000 would allow the school to finish fitting out their new site and purchase additional equipment. (£100 for play equipment for use indoors as there is not an outdoor play area. £540 for new furniture. £150 for display boards to display children's work. £210 for art, craft and other materials for both centres.)
- 11. Frimley Green library has requested additional funding of £1,000 (£1,885 already funded) towards the cost of the new carpet.
- 12. At the last meeting, Members agreed to fund £1,720 of the agreed £2,500 to Chobham Fire Crew for preventative work. A remainder of £780 still requires funding.
- 13. St Francis Pre-school has requested funding of £2,000 to fund a secure fence and lockable gate around the outside play area to allow children to make better use of it.
- 14. Disability Challengers provide play and leisure opportunities for disabled children and young people across Surrey. DC does this at Challengers Guildford, an all year round playcentre, and through their Leisure Development Project. DC also support and promote the inclusion of disabled children in mainstream leisure services. This Easter DC will be running a Camberley Playscheme for children age 4 – 12 and a Camberley youth scheme for young people age 13 – 18. The youth scheme has a varied programme including Ceramic Workshop, Archery, Bowling, Horse riding, Intech Centre (hands-on science and technology centre – Winchester). All young people are supported by enthusiastic, confident staff, committed to increasing choice for young people. Space each day will be provided for young people who benefit from one to one support. In addition Challengers Camberley Saturday Playscheme will be re starting after securing a new venue. DC are actively fundraising for all Disability Challengers projects in Surrey Heath, any funding would be gratefully received and will make a difference to local children and young people.
- 15. Parity for Disability is a local charity providing services for children and young adults with multiple disabilities. Parity runs a day service based in Surrey Heath, in the Old Dean Youth and Community Centre. This is currently providing a service for 20 young adults who attend between one and five days a week. Staff are employed on a one to one basis. Each student (person using the service) is working towards personal development targets this is a very individual programme built around a student's abilities, needs and aspirations. Both physiotherapists and speech therapists develop individual programmes for students. Where

appropriate students also work with music therapists. An allocation of £2,660 would be used by Parity to update computer equipment with specialist adaptations as well as a digital camera. This equipment would support the students in all aspects of their programmes.

- 16. Youth Development Service is planning specific courses for young people at risk of engaging in anti-social behaviour. The courses will be run from the Old Dean Youth Centre. Each courses costs £2,500. It is proposed that one of these courses be funded by the Local Committee's pooled budget.
