SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL LOCAL COMMITTEE (Surrey Heath)

MEMBERS' ALLOCATIONS

19th October 2006

KEY ISSUE

To set out the funding available for County Councillors' allocations for 2006/07, and consider requests received.

SUMMARY

This report lists and makes recommendations on bids received for Members' Allocations that have been sponsored by at least one Member.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Local Committee :

- 1. Agree the allocations detailed in paragraphs 10 25.

BACKGROUND

- The budget available to Members is £66,000 of revenue funding to be spent on local projects to promote the social, environmental or economic well-being of the people of Surrey Heath. This amounts to £11,000 for each County Member of the Committee. An additional capital allocation of £35,000 has been made available to each Surrey County Council Local Committee.
- 2. The current allocations are set out in Annex A to this report, together with the balance remaining to be spent.

3. At the Local Committee meeting on 18th July 2006 Members agreed to pool £5,000 each into a central pooled fund and retain £6,000 each for local allocation. Members also agreed that a maximum level of revenue funding of £3,000 would be considered for each project but that projects over £3,000 may be considered for capital funding.

Members' Allocation Criteria for 2006/07

4. Members' Allocations can only be used for purposes that fall under Surrey County Council's legal powers. In summary, this means that funds must be used either for a Surrey County Council service, or under the power to promote the social, economic or environmental well-being of the area contained in the Local Government Act 2000.

5. Criteria to be considered should include whether projects:

- a. support the priorities of Making Surrey a Better Place:
 - to learn and develop
 - to live and do business
 - to travel
 - where vulnerable people are more independent
 - where people feel safe
 - where everybody matters
- b. support the priorities of the Community Strategy for Surrey Heath:
 - Health
 - Housing and Employment
 - Transport
 - Safety
 - Community Support
 - Education
 - Environment
- c. Meet demonstrable local needs
- d. Be possible to implement within the time and budget, offer value for money, have a clear audit trail and demonstrate its impact within 12 months of receiving funding.
- e. The funding needed is "one-off". Any organisation that uses funding from this source will have to make arrangements for securing any future ongoing funding necessary for their project.
- f. The project will give long-term benefit and be preventative in purpose.
- g. The project targets more disadvantaged areas or communities.
- h. Local Committee funding will unlock more funding from other sources.
- i. There is no other probable alternative source of funding

The funding should not:

- be used to fund schools for the direct delivery of the National Curriculum as this is already resourced on a formula basis by the County Council
- be used as a "grant" to an individual
- sponsor a political party, including contributing to the expenses of any conference, meeting or other event organised by or on behalf of the party.

Capital Funding

6. The £35,000 capital is primarily allocated for support to the voluntary sector, however this funding may be used for other functions.

Members' Allocation Procedure for 2006/07

- 7. To be considered projects need to be sponsored by their local County Councillor in the first instance.
- 8. If the local County Councillor feels that a project meets the criteria and wishes to sponsor the project and put it forward to the Local Committee for approval, then a bid form (Annex B) needs to be completed by the group applying for funding and returned to the Local Partnerships Team. The Local Partnerships Team will confirm eligibility and, if appropriate, will ensure the project is included in the next Members Allocations Local Committee report for Local Committee approval.
- 9. If the Local Committee approves the funding then the Local Partnership Team will forward a Service Level Agreement to the group for completion and on receipt of a fully completed Service Level Agreement form will ensure payment is made.

PROPOSALS FROM POOLED BUDGET

 10. Repairs to the Speed Indicator Device Member Name: Lavinia Sealy Project cost £1,000 Amount requested £1,000 (100%) To fund repairs following vandalism.

11. Camberley Youth for Christ.

Member Name: David Ivison Project cost £3,600 Amount requested £2,000 (56%) Training for a listener to support young people at Kings International College, Tomlinscote and possibly Collingwood.

12. Camberley Churches Together.

Member Name: Maurice Neighbour and Fred Chipperfield Project cost £12,000 Amount requested £2,000 (17%) Contribution towards a year long project to produce a directory for local people listing all church activities in the Camberley area.

13. New Neighbours

Member Name: Maurice Neighbour Project cost £350 Amount requested £350 (100%) To provide the folders for New Neighbours packs. New Neighbours is a voluntary scheme that visit people who have just moved into the Surrey Heath area with information packs including information on local government, doctors surgeries, local groups, schools, churches etc.

PROPOSALS FROM CAPITAL BUDGET

14. Heatherside Church.

Member Name: David Ivison Project cost \pounds 1,420 Amount requested \pounds 1,000 (70%) Purchase of seating for furnishing a room in the church for meetings.

15. Chobham Recreation Ground.

Member Name: Lavinia Sealy Project cost £25,850 Amount requested £2,500 (10%) Resurfacing of the games court.

16. **Camberley Citizen's Advice Bureau**. Member Name: Lavinia Sealy Project cost £1 559 27

Project cost £1,559.27 Amount requested £1,559.27 (100%) Updating the computers and printer.

17. Windlesham Field of Remembrance Trustees and Task Force.

Member Name: Alan Peirce Project cost £75,412 Amount requested £3,000 (4%) Refurbishing the play area.

18. Tringham Hall Management Trust.

Member Name: Lavinia Sealy Project cost £20,000 Amount requested £5,000 (25%) Refurbishment of toilets at Tringham Hall.

19. Watchetts Junior School.

Member Name: Fred Chipperfield Project cost £12,000 Amount requested £3,000 (25%) Refurbishment of play ground.

20. National Childbirth Trust.

Member Name: David Ivison Project cost £2,580 Amount requested £652.17 (25%) Start up cost (including teaching aids) to train an ante-natal teacher to cover Frimley, Camberley, Heatherside, Frimley Green, Mytchett and Deepcut.

21. Hubble Community Enterprise

Member Name: Maurice Neighbour Project cost £3,725 Amount requested £2,000 (54%) To provide a stage, puppets, accessories and a storage shed for a puppet based project. This project will promote the emotional well being of young people through interactive role play in schools, community groups and residential homes. The project also seeks to work with older people and young people together to bridge the generation gap.

PROPOSALS FROM INDIVIDUAL REVENUE ALLOCATIONS

22. Camberley Baptist Church.

Member Name: Fred Chipperfield Project cost £2,600 Amount requested £1,000 (38%, 76% in total with Maurice Neighbour)) Funding to purchase new crockery and equipment for the kitchen to support the running of a day centre for older people and other activities.

23. Camberley Baptist Church.

Member Name: Maurice Neighbour Project cost £2,600 Amount requested £1,000 (38%, 76% in total with Fred Chipperfield) Funding to purchase new crockery and equipment for the kitchen to support the running of a day centre for older people and other activities.

24. Bisley Resident's Association.

Member Name: Lavinia Sealy Project cost £880 Amount requested £720 (82 %) Printing of four issues of a local newsletter.

25. West End and Bisley Neighbourhood Group.

Member Name: Lavinia Sealy Project cost £615 Amount requested £300 (50 %) Contribution towards an open day to be held in November 2006.

CONCLUSION AND REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

26. The spending proposals put forward for this meeting have been assessed against the County standards for appropriateness and value for money and it is recommended that they should be approved.
