# SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL LOCAL COMMITTEE (Surrey Heath)

## **MEMBERS' ALLOCATIONS 2007/08**

6<sup>th</sup> March 2007

#### **KEY ISSUE**

To set out the funding available for County Councillors' allocations for 2007/08, and consider the requests received.

#### **SUMMARY**

This report lists and makes recommendations on bids received for Members' Allocations that have been sponsored by at least one Member.

#### **BACKGROUND**

- 1. The budget available to Members is £66,000 of revenue funding to be spent on local projects to promote the social, environmental or economic well-being of the people of Surrey Heath. This amounts to £11,000 for each County Member of the Committee.
- 2. An additional capital allocation of £35,000 has been made available to each Surrey County Council Local Committee.

- 3. The current allocations are set out in Annex A to this report, together with the balance remaining to be spent.
- 4. At the last meeting Members agreed to pool £5,000 into a central fund.
- 5. Members also agreed that a maximum level of funding of £3,000 would be considered for revenue funded projects but that projects over £3,000 may be considered for capital funding.

#### Members' Allocation Criteria for 2007/08

- 6. Members have been allocated £11,000 each revenue funding plus an additional £35,000 capital funding for the committee as a whole to allocate.
- 7. Members' Allocations can only be used for purposes that fall under Surrey County Council's legal powers. In summary, this means that funds must be used either for a Surrey County Council service, or under the power to promote the social, economic or environmental well-being of the area contained in the Local Government Act 2000.
- 8. Criteria to be considered should include whether projects:
  - a. supports County Council's Corporate plan 2007/08, *One: Outstanding Council Making Surrey a better place*, which sets out the following four priorities:
    - Improving highways and maintaining roads;
    - Ensuring that looked after children grow up better equipped for life, in particular through education;
    - Increasing the number of vulnerable adults able to live independently;
    - Increasing waste minimisation and recycling.
  - b. support the priorities of the Community Strategy for Surrey Heath:
    - Health
    - Housing and Employment
    - Transport
    - Safety
    - Community Support
    - Education
    - Environment
  - c. Meet demonstrable local needs
  - d. Be possible to implement within the time and budget, offer value for money, have a clear audit trail and demonstrate its impact within 12 months of receiving funding.
  - e. The funding needed is "one-off". Any organisation that uses funding from this source will have to make arrangements for securing any future ongoing funding necessary for their project.
  - f. The project will give long-term benefit and be preventative in purpose.
  - g. The project targets more disadvantaged areas or communities.
  - h. Local Committee funding will unlock more funding from other sources.
  - i. There is no other probable alternative source of funding

#### The funding should not:

- be used to fund schools for the direct delivery of the National Curriculum as this is already resourced on a formula basis by the County Council
- be used as a "grant" to an individual

 sponsor a political party, including contributing to the expenses of any conference, meeting or other event organised by or on behalf of the party.

## **Capital Funding**

The £35,000 capital is primarily allocated for support to the voluntary sector, however this funding may be used for other functions.

#### Members' Allocation Procedure for 2007/08

- 9. To be considered projects need to be sponsored by their local County Councillor in the first instance.
- 10. If the local County Councillor feels that a project meets the criteria and wishes to sponsor the project and put it forward to the Local Committee for approval, then a bid form (Annex B) needs to be completed by the group applying for funding and returned to the Local Partnerships Team. The Local Partnerships Team will confirm eligibility and, if appropriate, will ensure the project is included in the next Members Allocations Local Committee report for Local Committee approval.
- 11. If the Local Committee approves the funding then the Local Partnership Team will forward a Service Level Agreement to the group for completion and on receipt of a fully completed Service Level Agreement form will ensure payment is made.

## **Delegated allocations**

- 12. On the 17 October 2006 the County Council amended the scheme of delegation to give Area Directors, in consultation with the Local Committee Chairman, authority to approve grants from Member's revenue allocations, subject to agreed criteria in order to minimise the time taken to respond to grant applications.
- 13. The criteria agreed by the Executive on 12 September 2006 are set out below:
  - (i) The application must have been endorsed by the appropriate local Member.
  - (ii)The application should be for a maximum of £1,000
  - (iii)Applications from private clubs or other membership organisations must clearly demonstrate the wider community benefit of the project
  - (vi) Projects must not contravene any of the Council's agreed policies or priorities
  - (v)The application should be for a future project, not a retrospective request
  - (vi)The application should not be to cover ongoing revenue costs
- 14. At the meeting on 26<sup>th</sup> July Members agreed the following additional criteria:
  - (i) The money is required before the next Local Committee meeting.
  - (ii) Each individual Member may sponsor up to two grants for approval in between each formal Local Committee meeting.
  - (iii)On receipt of a completed application form that is supported by the local Member the application will be shared with the six County Councillors for their agreement prior to approval by the Area Director.
  - (iv) Allocations made under delegated powers will be reported back to the next Local Committee meeting.
