

OFFICER REPORT TO LOCAL COMMITTEE

(Surrey Heath)

Members Allocations 08/09

10th July 2008

KEY ISSUE

To set out the funding available for County Councillors' allocations for 2008/09, and consider the requests received.

SUMMARY

This report lists and makes recommendations on bids received for Members' Allocations that have been sponsored by at least one Member.

OFFICER RECOMMENDATIONS

The Local Committee (Surrey Heath)

- 1. Agree to pool £5,000 per Members into a central revenue fund for 08/09.
- 2. Agree a maximum level of funding per project for revenue allocations of £3,000.
- 3. Agree that capital projects over £3,000 may be considered by the Local Committee.
- 4. Agree the criteria in paragraphs 6 12
- 5. Agree to delegate the power to approve revenue bids up to £1000 to the Area Director in consultation with Members as outlined in paragraphs 16 19.
- 6. Agree the allocations detailed in paragraphs 20 31
- 7. Notes the allocations agreed under delegated powers in paragraphs 32 and 33

INTRODUCTION

 The budget available to Members is £66,000 of revenue funding to be spent on local projects to promote the social, environmental or economic well-being of the people of Surrey Heath. This amounts to £11,000 for each County Member of the Committee.

- 2. An additional capital allocation of £35,000 has been made available to each Surrey County Council Local Committee.
- 3. The current allocations are set out in Annex A to this report, together with the balance remaining to be spent.
- 4. Previously Members agreed to pool an amount from each fund to a central pot. Members are asked to agree to pool £5,000 for 2007 / 08.
- 5. Previously Members also agreed that a maximum level of funding of £3,000 would be considered for each project. Members are asked to discuss this and agree to this maximum level for revenue funded projects only. Members are asked to agree that projects over £3,000 may be considered for capital funding.

Allocation criteria 08 / 09

- 6. To be considered, projects should support County Council's Corporate plan 2007/08, One: Outstanding Council Making Surrey a better place, which sets out the following four priorities:
 - · Improving highways and maintaining roads;
 - Ensuring that looked after children grow up better equipped for life, in particular through education;
 - Increasing the number of vulnerable adults able to live independently;
 - Increasing waste minimisation and recycling.
- 7. and should support the priorities of the Community Strategy for Surrey Heath:
 - Health
 - Housing and Employment
 - Transport
 - Safety
 - Community Support
 - Education
 - Environment
- 8. The project must also be possible to implement within the time and budget, offer value for money, have a clear audit trail and demonstrate its impact within 12 months of receiving funding.
- 9. The Local Committee does not have enough money to fund all the good ideas. In choosing what to fund, the Local Committee considers projects which
 - have the support of the Local County Councillor
 - benefit a variety of communities of interest (for example, young people, old people, ethnic minorities, disabled), and different areas of Surrey Heath;
 - A large project that benefits a lot of people will take priority over a project that benefits only a few people.
- 10. Within this framework the Committee seeks to assure:
 - The funding is needed "one-off". All payments are made on a one off basis. There is no expectation of future funding. Consequently any organisation that uses funding from this source will have to make arrangements for securing any future ongoing funding

- necessary for their project. If the project involves ongoing costs such as maintenance, repair etc. there must be confirmation that an organisation has agreed to take on these costs.
- The project will commence within 12 months of Local Committee approval.
- The project will give long-term benefit and be preventative in purpose.
- The project targets more disadvantaged areas or communities.
- Local Committee funding will unlock much more funding from other sources.
- If small and local, the project has a significant impact on the quality of life of the people affected.
- 11. Capital funding must meet the above criteria but also:
 - it must be applied to a physical asset/s with life of more than one year
 - it must not be used to meet staffing costs or other routine running costs

12. The funding should not:

- be used to fund schools for the direct delivery of the National Curriculum, as this is already resourced on a formula basis by the County Council
- be used as a "grant" to an individual
- sponsor a political party, including contributing to the expenses of any conference, meeting or other event organised by on behalf of the party
 - **NB** Some Surrey residents' associations and local societies have to register as political parties because they have candidates standing in District, County or General Elections
- a project which has already started

Capital Funding

13. To be considered projects need to be sponsored by their local County Councillor in the first instance.

Allocation Procedure

- 14. If the local County Councillor feels that a project meets the criteria and wishes to sponsor the project and put it forward to the Local Committee for approval, then a bid form (Annex B) needs to be completed by the group applying for funding and returned to the Local Partnerships Team. The Local Partnerships Team will confirm eligibility and, if appropriate, will ensure the project is included in the next Members Allocations Local Committee report for Local Committee approval.
- 15. If the Local Committee approves the funding then the Local Partnership Team will forward a Service Level Agreement to the group for completion and on receipt of a fully completed Service Level Agreement form will ensure payment is made.

Delegated Powers

- 16. On the 17 October 2006 the County Council amended the scheme of delegation to give Area Directors, in consultation with the Local Committee Chairman, authority to approve grants from Member's revenue allocations, subject to agreed criteria in order to minimise the time taken to respond to grant applications.
- 17. The criteria agreed by the Executive on 12 September 2006 are set out below:
 - (i) The application must have been endorsed by the appropriate local Member.
 - (ii)The application should be for a maximum of £1,000
 - (iii)Applications from private clubs or other membership organisations must clearly demonstrate the wider community benefit of the project
 - (vi) Projects must not contravene any of the Council's agreed policies or priorities
 - (v)The application should be for a future project, not a retrospective request
 - (vi)The application should not be to cover ongoing revenue costs
- 18. The amended scheme of delegation also enables Local Committees to, by resolution of the Committee, retain the power to approve all grants from Members' revenue allocations, in which case the Area Director will have no authority to approve any such grant from an allocation of a Member of that Committee. In order to minimise the time taken to respond to grant applications, it is suggested that this Local Committee does not retain this power.
- 19. The County Council agreed that the Local Committee could further outline the circumstances in which the Area Director may exercise his or her delegated authority by adding to the criteria set out in paragraph 9 of this report. These are as follows:
 - (i) The money is required before the next Local Committee meeting.
 - (ii) Each individual Member may sponsor up to two grants for approval in between each formal Local Committee meeting.
 - (iii)On receipt of a completed application form that is supported by the local Member the application will be shared with the six County Councillors for their agreement prior to approval by the Area Director.
 - (iv) Allocations made under delegated powers will be reported back to the next Local Committee meeting.

PROPOSALS FROM INDIVIDUAL REVENUE ALLOCATIONS 20. Hubble Enterprise

To run an Old Dean holiday club at Pine Ridge School, costs include volunteer T-shirts, expenses and craft materials. 100 young people will attend the club over a 5 day period for activities designed to increase confidence and promote working together.

21. Youth Development Service

To run Arts, Sports and adventurous activities for a summer programme for 13-17 year olds on the Old Dean Estate, Camberley. This programme will help to reduce anti-social behaviour by helping young people develop new skills, learn about respect for each other and for the community.

22. Youth Development Service

To purchase a filing cabinet for safe storage of play equipment and activities used at the newly opened Bagshot Youth Café, a meeting place for 13-19 year olds.

PROPOSALS FROM POOLED BUDGET

23. Youth Development Service

Training costs towards Duke of Edinburgh expedition to Sweden. Funding will cover instructor and assessor costs. 16 young people from the Chobham and St Michael's area will benefit from this funding.

24. Surrey Fire and Rescue

Part funding for a new DVD for the Safe Drive Stay Alive initiative. A new DVD is needed to keep the message relevant. This project is available to all young people in Surrey and is usually held at Dorking Halls. The aim is to reach 100% of Surrey students this year. This allocation will require a variation to the limit of £3,000 if agreed. Each Local Committee in Surrey has been asked to contribute.

25. Camberley Town Centre CIC

Funding towards costs for street entertainment at a proposed "Party in Park Street" event to be held in Camberley Town Centre on Saturday 16th August. This event will reintroduce the newly pedestrainised area of Park Street, part of the Atrium Development to members of the public.

PROPOSALS FROM CAPITAL BUDGET

26. Bisley Scouts

Funding towards refurbishing kitchen, insulate roof and install new fuse board at the scout and guide headquarters. This will make the building safer and enable cookery sessions to be held.

27. St Francis Hall

Funding to resurface car park to allow children and the disabled to access the hall safely and to avoid parking on the road.

28. Heather Ridge School Parent Teacher Association

Funding to cover costs to install new toilet block at the swimming pool. At present the pool does not have toilet facilities. This will allow the facility to be used in the summer as the only toilets available now are in the main school building.

29. Bisley Village Hall

Funding to replace the roof in the Jubilee room. This will allow 15 local organisations and local residents to continue using the hall to provide local services.

Funding to improve disabled access to the toilets and ensure all are able to use the facilities.

RETURNED FUNDS

- 35. £500 has been returned to Maurice Neighbour's individual allocation. This had been allocated to Surrey Police originally for a residential trip for young people and then varied to cover costs for bikes. This funding has not been spent and so will be added to Maurice Neighbour's allocation for this year.
- 36. £2,815 has been returned to Chris Pitt's individual allocation. This had been allocated to the Deepcut Village Association to improve acoustics in the hall. This has been identified as a fault with the building and so alternative funds were found.

CONCLUSION AND REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

37. The spending proposals put forward for this meeting have been assessed against the criteria and also against County standards for appropriateness and value for money and it is recommended that they should be approved.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

38. The agreed payments will be progressed for payment as soon as possible. Agreement forms will be sent to the organisations and payment made when the form is returned.

Criteria for Members' Allocations

To be considered, projects should support County Council's Corporate plan 2007/08, One: Outstanding Council Making Surrey a better place, which sets out the following four priorities:

- Ensuring that looked after children grow up better equipped for life, in particular through education;
- Increasing the number of vulnerable adults able to live independently;
- Increasing waste minimisation and recycling.

 - **NB** Some Surrey residents' associations and local societies have to register as political parties because they have candidates standing in District, County or General Elections
- a project which has already started

Capital Funding

Capital funding must meet the above criteria but also:

- it must be applied to a physical asset/s with life of more than one year
- it must not be used to meet staffing costs or other routine running costs

- If the County Councillor feels the project meets the criteria and wishes to support the
 project, the applicant should complete the bid form and return it to the Local
 Partnerships Team. They will confirm compliance with the allocation criteria and if
 this is met, will ensure the project is included in the next report to the Local
 Committee for their approval.
- 3. If the funding is approved, the Local Partnerships Team will complete the allocation process by sending out a confirmation letter, funding agreement form and payment advice form. Once these are received back, the payment can be made.
- 4. Evidence of expenditure (ie. Invoices and/or receipts totalling the amount given) should be sent through to the Local Partnerships Team within 3 months of receipt of the funding.
