Q5 Provide evidence of the local needs which the funding would address This super output area of the Old Dean is identified as a priority area in Surrey in the Index of Multiple Deprivation. It is ranked 5 th within the top priority grouping relating to Children and Young people group in Surrey. This is further evidenced by Camberley East being ranked 29th in Surrey from the IMD 2007 data, ranked 4 th in income	Provide data, e.g. Index of Multiple Deprivation, Joint Strategic Needs Assessment, and details of any local consultation which support your application for this area.
deprivation affecting children, ranked 5 th in income, and 7 th in education skills and training. The data confirms that the complex harder to reach cases within the Old Dean community are vulnerable in a number of diverse ways.	
Q6 Describe the project or activities you are seeking funding for Historically the Old Dean has benefited from intervention and support from a wide range of organisations. The area is supported by a range of community groups, many of which have a successful track record of working well in partnership. The Old Dean Community Group (previously The Old Dean Advice Centre) is a standalone charity with the membership of the group reflecting a strong local partnership in its own right, being constituted of local organizations, agencies and local residents. The Old Dean Community Group (ODCOG) is uniquely positioned to provide the overarching support to the project and retain the local focus of delivery. It will be crucial that a partnership approach is retained if the funding is forthcoming and enables the project to go forward. Esher Road provides mixed social housing family accommodation. As previously identified, IMD data, shows that the area has a number of vulnerabilities and as such is designated as 'in need' within Surrey. The families identified are hard to reach and are less able to access services which could help to break down the cycle of poverty and dependency on Benefits. For some families this has become a generational way of life. The concept behind this project bid focuses in providing support for hard to reach families who have already been identified through the referral system. At present two family support workers are employed by the Surrey Heath Confederation of Schools. These workers provide targeted assistance and support for the child to enable the family to overcome a specific concern. The present	Briefly describe the proposed actions and the activities that will be undertaken; explain how the project would offer something new to the area
service is focused around the child and is intended to cover short-term interventions only. Whilst this short-term approach helps overcome many concerns for the family, it does not address the issue of dependency on external support that has evolved over a period of years. The proposed project will deal with the broader scope of working to introduce change to those families to help them overcome their dependency, and will deliver intervention over a more sustained period. It is envisaged that the proposed project will provide a support worker to deal with the more complex cases that exist, over a sustained period providing the families with a real opportunity to change their life chances. This post will not encroach upon the statutory social worker responsibilities.

The project is based around longer-term provision of support for up to a dozen families who have been identified as in need. A partnership approach will be followed with the support worker providing resource alongside existing service(s) to maximise measurable outcomes. This approach will help to ensure that there is good co-ordination and no duplication amongst partners.	
The project scoped to date is reliant upon securing resources to enable delivery for an initial period of a year. If the bid is successful, other applications will be made to alternative funding streams to extend the project for a further year. The project will be designed to provide clear outcomes relating to each of the families, these will be tailored to individual family needs, and will take into account any existing targets from other professionals that are working with the families. Further detailed discussions will inform ODCoG as to the profile of the worker, but the skill set is similar to that of a social worker/Home-start volunteer. This person will become a friendly face that works with the families, by visiting them regularly (every other week) to help them develop the necessary life skills that will enable to overcome their reliance on external support. This could include eating well (within a lower budget), shopping on-line, and developing the capacity that provides the confidence and foundation to question and encourage participation, which will benefit all family members. This being the forerunner to identifying other options thast will give an improved chance for these families thus breaking the poverty cycle.	
Confirmation of employment terms is a crucial aspect that this group considered which is closely linked to the sustainability and funding decisions relating to this project. The Surrey Heath Confederation of Schools is based on the Old Dean, and the family support workers also use Cordwalles School as their base. It is considered that the school could also be an ideal location for the support worker. Further discussions with the Surrey Heath Confederation of Schools are underway in order to provide the operational detail necessary to manage this project successfully.	
Q7 What outcomes and outputs will you be aiming to achieve and how do they help SCC achieve its strategic priorities? Please also say what SCC services are involved and the named contact(s). The specific outcomes are difficult to quantify at this stage as many of them will be focused around softer outcomes. Measures of success can be defined further when the referred families are known. For example, the outcomes can be set around a number of measures ranging from making a positive contribution with regard to improvements in anti-social behaviour in some instances, or agreed improvements in attendance at school. It could be as simple as identifying an improvement in enjoying and achieving, such as the development of parents use of technology (digital inclusion)	An outcome is the direct difference your project will make. Q8 How would you involve residents in the project?	Describe how you would establish a relationship with
The funding application is from the Old Dean Community Group (ODCoG), whose membership comprises both statutory services (borough/county/faith/community learning/voluntary/education/police) and community representatives. The core rationale of the group is based upon the value and belief in working together to build the capacity of the Old Dean community. Our diverse membership enables us to maximise communications with a wide range of community groups, which is of mutual benefit. However, this project presents the ODCoG group with a chance to enhance its participation within the sphere of service provision and develop further as a charity by working in partnership. This funding opportunity gives the excluded families who are the focus of this intervention a chance to become included, and to participate and benefit from the support networks that already exist within the Old Dean. This bid does not assume that the project is a panacea to the complex range of challenges within family life for those most disadvantaged. However it does target the most vulnerable within the Old Dean community providing concentrated	residents and voluntary organisations

Two options with this project:	
Firstly, as mentioned previously ODCOG is working with the Surrey Heath Confederation of Schools, investigating whether the role could be incorporated within their ongoing remit but maintaining the strong ties to ODCOG.	
Secondly, Surrey Community Foundation has suggested that funding donors may be willing to support this initiative over a sustained period.	
Q10 How will you measure your success in carrying out the activities and achieving the outcomes you have set out above?	We don't want to create reporting burdens so do keep systems simple, realistic and informative.
The ODCoG group will monitor outcomes through regular reports. Reporting will focus on activities undertaken and outcomes achieved. Joint supervision will be provided within the remit of the Confederation of Schools to enable a co- ordinated approach with other outreach staff. The part-time worker will work alongside this organisation, the children's centre, youth centre, health visitors and social workers to maximise efficiencies of collaborative working across the area.

The funding will provide the project with an initial 12-month period.	milestones will form the basis of that update
The main outcomes will be focused around capacity for achievement of the family. Each referred family will require specific and different outcomes and measures. Further, a base line for the project will need to be established.	
There will need to be a defined and realistic focus on priorities that include personal responsibility and prevention and a focus on working together to meet the needs of this neighbourhood in a sustainable way.	
Other funding streams will be sought to extend the project for 2nd year.

The support and understanding from local members is consistently good, as is the support from local officers and there is a genuine wish to work in partnership to help overcome adversity in the area. The partnership has evolved into ODCoG, and was previously the Old Dean Advice Centre, which was supported by Mike Abbott in 2005 when the centre initially opened.	profile of disadvantage locally and of the opportunities for joint working and leadership.
The group will be vacating the centre premises in March 2011, as it decided that the premises no longer represented good value. The existing service provision will be retained, and will be provided from different venues located across the estate. ODCOG is currently working on the effective migration of the services in preparation for 2011.	
There is a also a multi-agency group of professionals that meets regularly to discuss and prioritise issues and projects that affect the Old Dean community. The group is currently looking at health and wellbeing, and NEETs – both of which issues can affect family life.
