What will be done?

The "Connect With The Community" programme is focused on implementing a self sufficient club that will offer considerable support to the local community, local councils, government agencies, local businesses in the Surrey/Hampshire area and also nationally.

Turners Boxing Academy is a performance sport orientated club focussed on improving healthy living, social inclusion and "being the best" that a person can be. Our aim is to "breed champions" of the future who will be role model citizens and community leaders. In order for the club to grow, sustain and excel, partners, sponsors and funders are now being approached.

The current facilities only partially support the aims and values of Turners Boxing Academy. The limitations of location, facilities, events and equipment need to evolve to be able to serve the community in an expanded capacity. We are proposing to set up regular Amatuer Boxing Events staged at the current Turners Boxing Academy throughout 2012 and 13.

Surrey Heath Borough Council Commercial Services tell us that "Boxing is a key sport in the borough of Surrey Heath for engaging typically hard to reach young people and with the club being situated in one of Surrey County Council's Priority Areas it has a pivotal role to play in providing positive opportunities for participation in sport. We recognise the club is staffed and managed by qualified people with a vast amount of experience who are able to cater for all abilities from beginner through to elite. In 2012 they will be acting as the Team Managers for Surrey Heath's boxing squad that will be competing in the Surrey Youth Games. This position holds a great deal of responsibility and is only entrusted to clubs who meet the highest safeguarding standards".

This funding application is seeking to set in place a competitive structure that is centred on Turner's Boxing Academy based in Collingwood College, Camberley, through the hiring of rapidly deployable:

- Equipments PA System, Lighting, Boxing Ring, Results Board, Competition Gloves, head-quards and Saches.
- Facilities Seating, Podium, Camera's and Screens, Changing room improvements.

 Officials – Expences payments for Doctor, Judges, Referee and MC.

With funding in place to support a "Boxing" competitive structure, more young people will be attracted to this sport and more coaches would be willing to support the club in its "Connect with the Community" programme, which compliments the Surrey Heath Borough Council in engaging typically hard to reach young people in the vicinity of the club.

We are applying for funding for two projects:

Community Action Team

This project will bring together young people to do projects for the benefit of the community. These could range from litter picks, to supporting community events, to improving a community area such as playgrounds or school. As a Youth Project we are often approached by young people who are doing their Duke of Edinburgh award and looking for ways of completing their Service element some already volunteer at our younger youth clubs. This will provide positive activities for young people, a platform for normal youth work (informal education etc), young people would be seen making a positive contribution to their community, in some instances they will learn new skills and young people will have a sense of and be recognised for their achievement. Participation will not be restricted to those doing DofE and we will look to recruit other young people we make contact with into the positive activity. We will look to arrange rewards for the young people for their participation such as trips out.

Lightwater Detached Team

WVYP has set-up and run a stakeholders group looking at youthwork in Lightwater. The group includes representatives from the Police, Parish Council, local church and SCC youth centre. It has identified some priority areas of work to keep young people from anti-social behaviour and to deliver more local youth work. We have done some detached work to understand the needs of local young people on the streets and this project will engage with those young people to deliver a programme of activities with them. Through our initial work we have also be able to help a NEET young person to access the new services being provided for them by the Youth Support Service.
