

OFFICER REPORT TO LOCAL COMMITTEE TANDRIDGE

GODSTONE GREEN FOOTPATH LIGHTING IMPROVEMENTS

14 December 2007

KEY ISSUE

To consider erecting new and upgrade existing lighting columns on Godstone Green.

SUMMARY

This report recommends the erection of 3 new lighting columns and the upgrading of 2 existing lighting columns along Public Footpath 126 across Godstone Green to provide a safer route to all pedestrians.

The upgrade will improve the lighting level of the surrounding area and increase the perception of safety for pedestrians.

OFFICER RECOMMENDATIONS

The Local Committee Tandridge is asked to agree:

- (i) the proposal of 3 new lamp columns along the Public Footpath 126 across Godstone Green as shown on Annex A.
- (ii) the proposal of upgrading 2 existing lighting columns along the Public Footpath across Godstone Green as shown on Annex A.

1 INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 1.1 After the renewal of the surface on Godstone Green Footpath by the Parish Council it was proposed that a new column be funded from an appropriate SCC budget.
- 1.2 It was also suggested that the funding extend to the maintenance and energy cost of new columns.
- 1.3 The 2 existing columns on this public footway are maintained by SCC, historically taken on as part of the 1974 rationalisation of Local Government.
- 1.4 The lighting will have to be upgraded to conform to an acceptable standard.

2 ANALYSIS

- 2.1 Investigation of the lighting levels required 3 new lighting columns to provide a consistent level of lighting on the footpath.
- 2.2 The 2 existing lighting columns will also have to be upgraded to increase the lighting footprint.
- 2.3 In some rural areas increased lighting levels are seen as a hindrance and might prove to be unpopular with local residents.

3 OPTIONS

- 3.1 No action can be taken on this request and the security of pedestrians may suffer.
- 3.2 Only the 1 requested lighting column can be erected but that will fall far below the current accepted standard.
- 3.3 The complete upgrade can go ahead and SCC can accept the relevant maintenance duties.

4 CONSULTATION

4.1 The County Councillor for Godstone and the Local Committee Chairman has supported requests for extra lighting.

5 FINANCIAL AND VALUE FOR MONEY IMPLICATIONS

5.1 The estimated cost of the proposal will come to approximately £ 10,000 excluding maintenance and energy costs.

- 5.2 Cost for the design could be funded from the 2007/2008 Local Allocation Strategy Allocation for Traffic Safety Improvements.
- 5.3 Implementation of the scheme could be considered in a report on the programme of Improvement Schemes for 2008/2009.

6 EQUALITIES AND DIVERSITY IMPLICATIONS

6.1 The upgrade of the existing and erection of the new lighting columns will raise the lighting levels in the surrounding area and act as a deterrent to possible illegal activities.

7 CRIME AND DISORDER IMPLICATIONS

7.1 The upgrade of the existing and erection of the new lighting columns will light up the surrounding area and act as a deterrent to possible illegal activities.

8 CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8.1 The lighting upgrade will increase the lighting level to an accepted standard.
- 8.2 The report recommends carrying out the lighting improvements to create safer environment for pedestrians.

9 REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

9.1 The proposal would improve pedestrian safety and encourage walking by creating a secure environment.

10 WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

10.1 The design will be progressed to confirm a cost estimate. This will be reported to the Local Committee in future improvement schemes.
