Whether you can give just a few hours or be a full-time carer, the Family Link scheme wants to talk to you.

Family Link supports families with disabled children by providing a carer to look after their child for a break. This gives the parents time to recharge while their child is in safe hands enjoying the experience of being with different people. Family Link carers offer a range of breaks, from a few hours after school once a month to overnight stays in the carers home.

The scheme is also looking for befrienders who can spend time with a young person in their home or help them take part in leisure activities. This helps them develop their independence and social skills.

Fee paid carers

The Family Link programme is particularly looking for two fee paid carers to work with children with complex health needs and autism. These carers work with parents to share the care of their disabled child.

In return for providing a minimum of 200 nights care a year to a number of severely disabled children (one at a time), fee paid carers receive:

- a weekly retainer of £200
- an allowance for every night a child stays
- regular training, supervision and 24 hours support
- four weeks holiday a year.
