

OFFICER REPORT TO LOCAL COMMITTEE (TANDRIDGE)

TANDRIDGE 2010 PARKING REVIEW - ANNEX C

2 JULY 2010

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This committee asked that a financial analysis be undertaken for introducing a residents parking scheme for Hillbury Road.
- 1.2 The costs below are based on best estimates and experiences in other areas. It is not possible to give definitive costs as there are a number of significant variables.
- 1.3 At this time, on-street parking is managed by Tandridge District Council on behalf of Surrey County Council. The District council has provided an estimate of an additional £36,600 per annum to provide this service. This is higher than other comparable locations across the County.

2. Start up costs

3. Ongoing operational costs

This part of the analysis has been based on a similar sized scheme already operational within the county. Please note these are estimates of additional cost directly attributable to this parking scheme. It is assumed parking enforcement is on-going in the area.

5. Permit costs

5.1 Officers have estimated that there will be approximately 80 permits sold per annum. Over 5 years equates to 400 permits. Therefore to recover the costs permits need to be in the region of £80 each.

6. Conclusions and recommendations

- 6.1 On the basis of this financial model, it is recommended that the permit cost is set at £75 per annum for the first permit and £100 for any second permit from the same address which is concurrently valid. Visitor permits should be set at £1 each and be valid for only one day.
- 6.2 If the permits are set at this level, all costs should be recovered over a five year period.
- 6.3 Officers will liaise with Tandridge District Council over the operation of this scheme.

Recommendations

i) a permit scheme is established for Hillbury Road, as detailed in the report to this Local Committee on the 4 June 2010 with the exception of the permit costs which are to be revised as per this annex C

- ii) permit costs are set at £75 per annum for the first permit and £100 for the second per household
- iii) visitor permits are £1 per permit, valid one day
- iv) that the County Council follows the due process to amend traffic regulation orders for the recommended parking controls to be implemented
- v) the scheme is introduced as part of the 2009 proposals (part 2 locations)
