Q6 Descri	ption of th	e project. What diffe	erence will this make?	What will be done?
The CR3 Soldiers was formed by a group of five young people in response to a 'Section 30' dispersal order imposed on the Tesco car park in Caterham Hill in 2008, where anti social behaviour by young people was taking place. This is located in a Ward (Westway) which has high indices of deprivation although masked by recent housing developments. Initially facilitated by the Surrey Youth Service, the five youngsters did research into facilities that young people might need in the area. They decided that they wanted a club run by young people themselves and then publicised their findings to the local community and received a good response, particularly from the local police who have given them a number of awards for their work.				to Hill is is h ople
At that time their main need was for accommodation where they could regularly hold a youth club and I secured the use of the Pavilion on the Green adjacent to Tesco in Guards Avenue.				
Since December 2009 we have been using this facility every Thursday night for two hours per week, three during the summer holidays, attracting 20-30 children and young people each session. We were given grants to help us start up, particularly from the Surrey Youth Opportunity and Capital Funds and also				

the High Sheriff's Fund. We also received another grant to take the children and young people out on trips and, so far, have done three of these, attracting in excess of 40 each time.

I look after fundraising and safeguarding and we have an accountant who looks after the accounts voluntarily. The Club itself is managed by Sarah Wilson a local mum and her daughter Sophie, now 21. Now, nearly four years on the Club still runs every Thursday and continues to be well used. We have purchased or acquired various bits of equipment including computer games, a pool table and lap top computers. We have a kitchen and "tuck shop" and, thanks to Sarah and Sophie, the Club works and there is little bad behaviour. We attract young people who do not want patronise the more conventional facilities available locally but who seem happy to "hang out". The original Soldiers have all done well, now having left school and Sophie is going to stand for the Parish Council this May.

THE FUTURE

The Club, encouraged by the Police want to open a second night of the week. We have conserved our grants well but need to find ways of securing the future by:

- Expanding our membership through better marketing to local schools.
- Opening the club for a second night each week as requested by police
- Employing a youth worker to work with the local community to attract the kind of young people who remain outside main stream youth provision.
- To work with the local Tesco store who we have approached to become a community partner

What will be done?

The Lingfield Parish Council requested volunteers to form a management committee to run a new club for the area. A committee was formed along with a couple of volunteers who were going to run the club on a day to day basis. During the period of time taken to set the wheels in motion, everyone dropped away except for myself, the Treasurer and the Secretary. We finally had all the paperwork, bank account, premises etc ready to go and had to make a decision to either give up or press on ahead and open the club.

I am pleased to say that we did the latter and opened the Club in January 2011. We have had our first successful year with 32 members, although a few have dropped away since then. We run a different activity each week, spa evening, sports night, baking cookies, take away night to name but a few and have had a couple of trips to the local Laserhub.

The kids love to have somewhere to go on a Friday, which is their evening and they are away from family life. If they do not wish to partake of the activity on offer, there is also a goal, table tennis, karaoke and pool available each week. We also have a chill out room for the older children to sit, talk and they can have tea/coffee/chocolate. There is always a volunteer with them and they do seem to like to spend time chatting with the adults.

The Club is now putting pressure on our lives, as we have very young children. We really need to be able to pass over the day to day running of the club i.e. organizing rotas, sourcing and purchasing items for activities etc. The two of us are both happy to volunteer to do some evenings and keep our hands in as well as staying with our management responsibilities. We have 8 adult volunteers, one volunteer with special needs – we do not count as a volunteer but as part of being part of the

community we feel we should include him if he wants to volunteer and two 15 year old volunteers who want the experience for their CV's. We are constantly requesting help from parents/community to keep the club running.

Therefore I am submitting this request for funding to enable us to employ a Youth Worker to work for 3 hours per week. The Lingfield Parish Council have offered to pay for half of the funding requirement and we therefore ask for the other half.

52 weeks x 3 hours per week @ £10 ph = £1560

£1560 divided between Parish Council & yourselves = £780 each.

Nature of the project We aim to build a new skate ramp for the children of Lingfield at Jenners Field in Lingfield Village. There are so many children that use				

this facility that there simply is not enough space for them all to use the current large ramp. Tandridge District council do not have funds to build any more ramps at this site until 2013 possibly 2014 so we have decided to try and raise funds by other means. Using the scooters and BMX's encourages the children to be outdoors and develop new skills. BMX'ing is now an Olympic sport and has become very popular with this generation of children and scooters are equally as popular if not more so. These sports encourage children of different ages to mix together and care for each other.

Who will benefit

The young people of Lingfield and the surrounding areas will benefit.

How will they benefit

The young people will benefit in the following way:

- More exercise for the children promoting a healthier lifestyle.
- The sport encourages different age groups to mix together enhancing relationships and community spirit.
- Develops social skills within the children as they all look out for each other and help each other. They often have to wait for each other on the ramps as they simply cannot all use the space at once. The children have respect for each other and each person's turn on the ramp.
- This sport challenges the children to develop new skills and tricks.
- Encourages a competition instinct amongst the children.
- As the children help to fund raise for a new ramp, I think they will look after the space more so than if it is just given to them as a matter of course.

Q6 Description of the project. What difference will this make?

I am seeking funds to purchase four complete sets of SCUBA diving equipment so that we can start a dive section at our training ship.

At the moment I have managed to train 6 cadets from our Unit to a basic level of competency at diving. I am aiming to expand this operation and offer courses throughout the Surrey area to more Marine/Sea Cadet Units.

What will be done?

Up till now I have trained these cadets through borrowing equipment from other areas within the Sea Cadet Corps however due to other pressures on this resource this equipment will not be available to me later this year.

Once established I will also like to make the equipment available to other youth groups in the area (such as scouts and girl guides) providing they have qualified instructors so that they can also promote the sport through their own youth groups.

Diving is a recognized qualification within the marine and sea cadets and for some children it can lead to a lifelong interest in marine life, conservation or just recreational diving.

For some it may lead to a career in the commercial diving field.

All diving within the sea/marine cadets is carried out under BSAC (British Sub Aqua Clubs) and as such we would form a BSAC Branch specifically to cater for cadets.

With this equipment I am also intending to train young adults from within our organization up to instructor level this will provide us with sustainability of the project through the coming years.

I am also seeking more funds from the national lottery sports for all award scheme. This will provide additional equipment that would enable the project to expand throughout the Surrey district as course numbers could be increased to 10 candidates per course.

It is envisaged that in the first year of operation 6 courses will be run to take cadets through from novice to sports diver.

Further courses at national level within the sea Cadet Corps can then be accessed that can take cadets further into the dive leader and assistant instructor levels.

The equipment would have a life span of 12 to 15 years with replacements purchased from receipts from course fees and equipment hire.
