Supply 2 hours per week paid work to develop the newly-established foodbank and clothing exchange at Ockford Ridge and Aaron's Hill. The foodbank works on a referral system from Children's Centres, health visitors, GPs, schools, churches etc. A parcel of food and clothing is made up for families who are in need to cover essentials for up to 3 days.

b) what needs will it address?

Essential need for food and warm clothes

c) what geographical area will it cover?

All of Godalming and villages including Milford, Witley and Elstead.

d) who will benefit?

St Marks expects up to 1 family per week will benefit – 52 within the year until project gets underway and the service better known. This is the pattern most foodbanks experience in the first year (data from Trussell Trust website). The UK foodbank network fed 41,000 people last year and over 70 foodbanks have been established.
