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Q5 What outcomes and outputs will you be aiming to achieve through these main functions and how do they help SCC achieve its priorities? Please also say if you are working with any SCC service and the named contact(s).

To increase the number of students cycling to school within the Cycling Town to 8% of students in Primary / Junior schools by 2011.

In addition and linking to Climate Change from www.transportdirect.info assumes that 1 mile done by a small car equals 0.2kg of CO2 emissions per traveller. So with two people in the car this would be 0.1kg per mile per person. Using this figure we can calculate the emissions reductions possible from diverting travel to school by car to bicycle. For example it's 0.4kg for a large car for 1 mile (0.2kg for two occupants).

So if we managed to divert 300 pupils from doing a 2 mile car journey in a large car (assuming two occupants), that would see a saving of 60kg in CO2 emissions.

As well as contributing to the objectives of Cycle Woking to increase the number of school children cycling to school, this would also benefit local authority reporting on the climate change national indicator 186 - reducing CO2 emissions in the local authority area.

An outcome is the direct difference your project will make. The outcomes and quantifiable outputs you specify will form part of our funding agreement with you.

Monthly monitoring of school cycle parking.

We don't want to create reporting burdens so do keep systems simple, realistic and informative. If you measure your success for other funders - could some of that information be used by us too?
