Question 1: Graham Woolgar

Re: Paper copies of agendas

Can a way be found to provide paper agendas for members of the public attending Local Committee meetings?

I understand that no-one wants to waste paper. However, if a member of the public does not have a tablet or laptop, following a Local Committee meeting without a paper agenda is difficult. Could a system be introduced as follows. Any member of the public intending to attend a local committee meeting would be able to request a paper copy of the agenda, with say a minimum advance notice of a week. This could then be collected by the named individual on arrival just before the meeting. In this way, only paper copies which would definitely be used would need to be produced.

Officer Response:

There are always five paper copies of the agenda available for members of the public and we advise anyone we know is coming that paper copies are not routinely provided, but that they can be accessed electronically. A summary of the item and recommendations are also available on the PowerPoint presentation to help the public. We'd be happy to provide a paper copy to any member of the public requesting one in advance. Very few members of the public attend for the whole meeting; the majority only come for a single item or to ask a question/present a petition.

Question 2: Graham Woolgar

Re: Walton & Hersham Parking Review

Please clarify the following with regard to the Walton & Hersham Parking Review:

- a) Is a Residents' Parking Zone going to be introduced consisting of the part of Winchester Road between High Street & Highfield Road or not? There have been conflicting reports about this.
- b) What is the likely completion date for the physical implementation of the changes resulting from the review?

Officer Response:

We received over 500 pieces of feedback to the parking review, and owing to the particularly complex nature of this specific review, analysis of all of the comments has taken some time. The feedback has been analysed and a draft report created, containing the comments (or a summary of the comments), along with officer recommendations. We are currently undertaking discussions with divisional members for the areas concerned, and anticipate that the final decisions are imminent. As soon as they have been made, our website will be updated to reflect them, and anyone who commented during the advertising period will be notified of the final decisions and our reasons for them. Traffic orders will then be made and implementation of the

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new signs and lines will start shortly afterwards – again, the website will be updated with the relevant information.

We appreciate that it is frustrating for people waiting for the outcome, but it is important that sufficient time is allowed to properly consider the issues people have raised.
