QUESTIONS, PETITIONS AND PROCEDURAL MATTERS

The Cabinet will consider questions submitted by Members of the Council, members of the public who are electors of the Surrey County Council area and petitions containing 100 or more signatures relating to a matter within its terms of reference, in line with the procedures set out in Surrey County Council's Constitution.

Please note:

1. Members of the public can submit one written question to the meeting. Questions should relate to general policy and not to detail. Questions are asked and answered in public and so cannot relate to "confidential" or "exempt" matters (for example, personal or financial details of an individual – for further advice please contact the committee manager listed on the front page of this agenda).
2. The number of public questions which can be asked at a meeting may not exceed six. Questions which are received after the first six will be held over to the following meeting or dealt with in writing at the Chairman's discretion.
3. Questions will be taken in the order in which they are received.
4. Questions will be asked and answered without discussion. The Chairman or Cabinet Members may decline to answer a question, provide a written reply or nominate another Member to answer the question.
5. Following the initial reply, one supplementary question may be asked by the questioner. The Chairman or Cabinet Members may decline to answer a supplementary question.

Members Questions**Question (1) Will Forster (Woking South):**

Late last year, Surrey County Council started to trial a booking system at Epsom's Community Recycling Centre. Please can the Cabinet confirm how the trial has gone?

On many occasions, there have been significant queues into the Martyrs Lane Community Recycling Centre. Has the Council been advised of the reasons for these recent delays at Martyrs Lane CRC in Woking? Will the County Council consider introducing a similar booking system at Martyrs Lane CRC to avoid these issues in future?

Reply:

The technology used to operate the Epsom community recycling centre (CRC) booking system has worked well and according to survey information it has been generally well received by site users. At busy times however there can be a week or so delay to obtain a booking slot.

The COVID secure operation that we have in place on all our CRCs mean that we have had to limit the number of people that can be present on site at any one time and this has led to queuing at some sites during peak times. Where necessary we have employed traffic marshals to manage the queuing traffic and we continue to ask that residents only make essential journeys to visit our CRCs in line with Government guidance.

We will continue to monitor the situation but there are no plans to introduce a booking system at other sites at the present time.
