7 BUS STOP CLEARWAYS

(Pages 17 - 22)

Surrey County Council (SCC) proposes to implement new / upgraded bus stop clearways at bus stops along several key bus routes in Surrey Heath, namely bus routes 1, 2, 3, 11 and 34/35. This is part of a package of measures funded by the Enterprise M3 Local Enterprise Partnership (EM3 LEP), aimed at increasing the accessibility of bus services and encouraging wider use of public transport.

Clearways are required to ensure that buses can access the bus stop waiting area to ensure step-free access onto/off buses and to aid bus service reliability.

8 PIRBRIGHT BENDS SPEED LIMIT

(Pages 23 - 34)

Gole Road, Gapemouth Road, Mytchett Place Road and Grange Road (collectively referred to as the Pirbright bends) have suffered a history of road collisions including several resulting in serious injury and some resulting in death. It is proposed that the existing speed limits on these roads (consisting of either 30mph, 40mph, and national speed limit) are consolidated to a consistent 40mph to enable an average speed camera system to be introduced. This will help to reduce traffic speeds which in turn will reduce the risk and severity of collisions.
