

Vision for Westborough 2020

Westborough will be a safe, clean and attractive place to live. Open and green spaces will be wellmaintained and its natural assets will be available for the enjoyment of the local community.

Residents will be proud of the local area and feel part of the community. They will be informed and engaged and work with service providers to identify and make improvements to the area.

Well run public services will be responsive to local needs and residents will have access to and take advantage of good quality education, healthcare, housing and recreational opportunities. Westborough will offer a range of excellent local facilities for the community.

High educational attainment, skills levels and aspirations will enable residents to access further education and training and existing and new job opportunities.

Westborough Strategy and Action Plan

The vision for Westborough sets out the aspirations for the area for 2020 and demonstrates what residents and partners are aiming to achieve over the next ten years.

Partners will focus on the following key issues to deliver the vision:

- > Increasing community pride, confidence and cohesion
- Improving skills and employment opportunities
- Improving the health of residents and reducing inequalities
- Supporting children, young people and their families

The strategy sets out the broad steps that partners and the community need to take and the commitments required under each of the above headings. It is accompanied by an action plan setting out in more detail the proposed actions.

Whilst the strategy and action plan specify steps to be taken collectively and individually, partners have also agreed the following general principles to achieve the desired outcomes for Westborough and its residents:

- (1) Partners will make a long-term commitment to work together and join up/coordinate service provision to maximise benefits to Westborough.
- (2) Partners will ensure that senior level commitment to Westborough is reflected in plans, strategies and actions throughout their organisations.
- (3) To enable more to be achieved from existing resources, a clearer picture of what partners are spending and doing in Westborough, including the voluntary and faith sectors, will be established.
- (4) Consultation data and intelligence will be shared, best use will be made of existing information and communication and engagement activities will be coordinated.
