Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy Priority Update: Improving Older Adults Health and Wellbeing

Purpose of item / paper	The purpose of this item is for the Board to receive a progress update of the 2014-16 action plan that is in place to improve older adults' health and wellbeing. The update takes the form of a report, which has been submitted to the Board to consider progress made over the past six months.
Surrey Health and Wellbeing priority(ies) supported by this item / paper	This item supports the delivery of the ' Improving Older Adults Health and Wellbeing ' priority of the joint Surrey health and wellbeing strategy. The action plan has identified objectives that will deliver the outcomes of the health and wellbeing strategy. These outcomes are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Older adults will stay healthier and independent for longer • More older adults with dementia will have access to care and support • Older adults will experience hospital admission only when needed and will be supported to return home as soon as possible • Older carers will be supported to live a fulfilling life outside caring
Financial implications - confirmation that any financial implications have been included within the paper	This joint action plan provides an overarching framework for spend on health and social care services for older people. There are no immediate or direct financial implications resulting from this action plan; spend associated to the objectives in this plan are within existing budgets. Many of the actions within the plan are the same or similar to those in the Better Care Fund work programme and are noted as such in this progress update.
Consultation / public involvement – activity taken or planned	This action plan is directly informed by public engagement undertaken as part of the Surrey Living and Ageing Well work programme and ongoing engagement through Clinical Commissioning Groups' public and patient engagement forums.
Equality and diversity - confirmation that any equality and diversity implications have been included within the paper	An over-arching equalities impact assessment was completed for the Older Adults PVR, which provided the foundation for a number of strands within the Older Adults Health and Wellbeing priority. As new strands have been developed additional assessments have been carried out, for example for Dementia Friendly Surrey. For any new areas of work will separate assessments will be conducted.
