No repeat offenders or patterns have been identified within the Borough. The Borough Command team will continue to monitor this and will provide feedback so that local crews can easily identify areas for targeted campaigns for Home Fire Safety Visits and Hot Strikes. For the year Runnymede crews completed 35 Hot Strikes with over 800 safety leaflets delivered to households.

## COMMUNITY FIRE PREVENTION

1.6 We will undertake intelligence-based Home Fire Safety Visits (HFSV), in the areas most in need of this service, using the provided data and local knowledge to target this work. Currently a target of 60% is expected for our crews to reach vulnerable people and the most at risk from fire in our communities. SFRS will work closely with Adult and Social Care teams to ensure the following are targeted.

- Adults over the age of 65 (Worse at 75)
- Individuals who live alone
- Individuals with Mental Health illnesses, including Dementia & Memory Loss
- Individuals with disability and mobility difficulties
- Individuals who are either Alcohol or Drug dependant
- Individuals who smoke (The above will be compounded if coupled with smoking)

## VOLUNTEERS SERVICE

Surrey fire volunteer service has become an essential part of Surrey fire and Rescue Service, when the volunteer service first started the aim was assist firefighters in prevention and education activities. This was achieved by not only working with the firefighters but also working independently, and arranging their own activities. Our volunteers have been asked to take on additional roles and on every occasion they have proved to be up for the challenge. We also have fully trained first aiders who are also defibrillator trained, and now that defibrillators are carried on the volunteer vehicles, there is a good chance the volunteers will become life savers as well. Training has also been carried out for LGV driving which allows fire engines to be taken to events where the crews are unable to attend.

In Runnymede the volunteer service has played a supportive role with the targeted HFSVs ensuring that the most vulnerable individuals are approached to ensure they are safe in their homes from fire related issues, have assisted with targeted campaigns for our residents of park homes, provided support and catering at large incidents and provided attendance alongside Firefighters at numerous shows and events, some of which are detailed below:

Water Safety Event	Volunteers assisted Operational crew in delivering water safety advice.
Black Cherry Fair	Volunteers provided Fire Safety information and booked Home visits.
Home Fire Safety talk for 'Cared for' Children - Chertsey	Home Fire Safety talk to 200 'Cared for' children and adults, demonstrating importance of Home Fire Safety, reducing risk and escape plans.
New Haw and Woodham Mid Summer Event	provided Home Fire Safety Visit Stand, activities for children, generated Home Fire Safety visit requests.
Egham Royal Show	Volunteers provided safety information to over 300 people, directing people to the stand and giving safety advice and generating HFSV's.
Moving of Service vehicles/equipment	Volunteers moved Service vehicles across the county to transport equipment to events.
Junior Citizens – held in Chertsey	1300 year 6 children from schools across Surrey provided with Fire Safety information over 2 weeks as part of a Multi Agency education event. The Fire set was delivered solely by volunteers.
Home Fire Safety Campaign - Traveller Site (Traylens)	3 days spent with the travelling community at Traylens, alongside SFRS personnel, Volunteers delivered 40 individual visits to residents.
Home Fire Safety Visit Campaign - Egham	Volunteers assisted for 3 days at this campaign, undertaking 26 Home Fire Safety Visits.
Home Fire Safety Campaign - Traveller Site (Stevens)	2 days spent with the travelling community at the Stevens site. Volunteers delivered over 30 Home Fire Safety Visits.
Cherrybrook Day Nursery - New Haw	Volunteers provided a Home Safety Stand for parents to educate on smoke detectors, escape plans and general Fire safety in the home.
