Further information is not readily available on what they consider a key worker without registering to go through the Housing Register assessment process, where applicants housing needs are assessed and a level of priority awarded using a banding system.
The Councils Allocations policy references key workers but as part of the Local Lettings Plan that aims to achieve wider social and economic objectives. For example, LLPs may be used to: 'Attract key workers into the borough by giving them priority for a small number of properties even though they may not fall within one of the reasonable preference categories.'
