

ITEM 8 – MEMBER ALLOCATIONS FUNDING – ADDENDUM

1. ADDITIONAL REVENUE BIDS

- 1.1** The following are additional funding proposals from the Local Committee's revenue funding.

BANSTEAD SHOPWATCH SCHEME **£2,000 revenue**

The Banstead Town Centre Management Group has submitted an application to establish a telephone Shopwatch Scheme. The Scheme will allow shopkeepers to be in radio contact with the Police, the closed circuit television (CCTV) centre and each other. Banstead village attracts criminals who commit theft, robbery and other crimes against our customers and shopkeepers. Therefore, the Scheme will be of benefit to up to 100 traders and local people in the community. The set-up cost for the scheme is £6,000, the remainder of which is to be met by shop-keepers. The ongoing revenue costs will also be fully met by the traders involved.

GRIT BIN, GLEDHOW WOOD, KINGSWOOD **£1,000 revenue**

Gledhow Wood Residents Association is seeking funding for the purchase, installation and 10-year filling of a salt/grit bin in Gledhow wood, Kingswood. The bin will be placed at the entrance to Gledhow Wood to help ensure safe access in and out of the residences there in snow and icy conditions. The total cost of the project is £1,000.

ORBIT SHED WORKSHOPS **£500 revenue**

TADWORTH COTTAGE HEDGE-CUTTING

£500 revenue

An application from the owner of Tadworth Cottage to significantly cut back and reduce the height of the Laurel hedge at the side of the property has been received. Several years ago the Borough Council cut back the bank and installed a kerb that has made access to the hedge difficult and dangerous. Although located at the owner's property, the work will be of benefit to the many drivers and pedestrians that use the road. It will provide much better visibility of on-coming traffic from the direction of Walton-on-the-Hill from this dangerous bend. The location of the hedge and the traffic hazard its removal will cause necessitate the hire of traffic lights while the work is completed. The total cost of the project is £840 with the remainder coming from the owner's personal means.

BURGH HEATH VILLAGE SIGN REFURBISHMENT

An application has been received from the Burgh Heath Residents' Association to fund the removal and refurbishment of two village signs. The refurbishment will help to visually improve the area by removing graffiti and addressing the general dilapidation of the rotting signs with peeling paintwork that has generated complaints from residents. Two sign posts will be coated in anti-graffiti paint. The total cost of the project is £1640 of which £250 has already been secured. The remainder is still to be found.

LOWER KINGSWOOD FETE FACILITIES

Lower Kingswood Village Fete Committee has submitted an application to refresh the equipment and facilities used to host the fete on an annual basis. The Village Fete is one of the focal events for the local community in Lower Kingswood and its surrounding areas. Its continued success will be dependent on the organisers having some basic equipment such as tables, stands and stalls that can be supplemented by community and business donations and external hire, as has been the case in previous years. The total cost of the project is £2,000 and the remainder is to be met by local sponsors and through fundraising events.

WARWICK SCHOOL, REDHILL ENERGY WORKSHOPS

£2,000 revenue

SATRO seeks funding to run two exciting science workshops at the Warwick Secondary School. The workshops will offer all 200 Year 9 students the chance to participate in a Discovering Renewable Energies Day in July 2013. Working with and alongside experienced scientists and engineers – part of the day will enable the students to learn about the education and career paths of professionals. They will be encouraged to think outside of the box and come up with solutions to the construction challenge from the limited materials provided. The workshops will help to develop employability skills through the students working on media projects and having telephone dialogue and interviews with high-level energy industry, pressure group and political experts. The total cost of the project is £2,000.

COMMEMORATIVE BENCHES, BANSTEAD VILLAGE

£3,250 revenue

The Banstead Village Residents Association has submitted an application to fund the purchase and installation of three benches in Banstead Village. The benches will replace the two worn, existing benches by the library and another bench destroyed by fire. They will benefit local library and Horseshoe users and bus travellers to and from shops in the High Street. The total cost of the project, including delivery and installation, is £3250.
