<p>Q5 Description of the project</p> <p>a) What will be done? The club firstly introduced a colts section in 1984, which later developed into a men's second team. Unfortunately, no junior teams have been run since 2000 but the club has had a number of junior members playing senior cricket. The main aspect of the project is to undertake the following:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop a junior team by providing practice and taster cricket sessions to local schools, which may eventually encourage the juniors to join the club. These sessions will be taken by our newly qualified cricket coach, who undertook the course during the winter. The cricket club funded the course as it is an 	<p>a) the work involved to achieve the aims of the project</p>

<p>essential requirement for junior cricket.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Replace the clubs outdoor practice facilities (cricket batting cages and nets), which are over 20 years old and are now very dated and require significant investment to bring the facilities up to a suitable modern practice facility. A modern facility is a pre-requisite when trying to attract new junior members to our club. • Advertise the club to the local community and surrounding area via improving our website and produce leaflets and posters about the club, which the club plan to distribute through the local area during April. 	
<p>b) What needs will it address?</p> <p>Currently the club has only 40 playing member (20 non playing members) who play in our three senior teams, but currently there are only 3 junior players playing in the seniors teams. The junior members play their junior cricket at other clubs but play senior cricket at Salfords. With the current aging profile of the players the club will struggle to exist in 5 years time if there are not sufficient players to supplement the existing players.</p> <p>To increase playing members the club wants to focus on junior cricket development as it sees this as the best way to interact more with the community and encourage junior members to join who live locally. In the past the club has proved it can retain juniors as about 25% of the existing members are former junior players.</p> <p>To attract new junior members and new members to the club we will need to invest in new practice facilities, which are over 20 years old. The batting cages and surface are worn and damaged in places and need to be replaced with some urgency. The club often finds that junior members end up the bigger clubs as they have facilities but are oversubscribed in terms of numbers and some of the juniors end up not playing. If Salfords Cricket Club can provide comparable facilities then we can ensure juniors end up participating regularly and enjoying their cricket.</p>	<p>b) the evidence that shows this project is required</p>
<p>c) What geographical area will it cover?</p> <p>The club catchment area is seen as Earlswood, Horley, Redhill, Salfords, Sidlow, and Woodhatch</p>	<p>c) where the people who will benefit from this project live</p>
<p>d) Who and how many people will benefit?</p> <p>We anticipate we will attract 15-20 juniors and possibly another 10 adult members. Overall our facilities will provide for over 100 people through the course of the year, for example we are hosting the local school cricket tournament and East Surrey Hospital will be using our facility for some of their games.</p>	<p>d) details of the groups of and the number of people whose lives will be improved by this project</p>
