Minutes Annex A: OPEN FORUM - PUBLIC QUESTIONS

Three questions were received from Waverley residents:

1. *John Jeffrey MBE*

"I am a Hascombe resident living in Markwick Lane close to its junction with the B2130 and I represent the village on the Waverley District Committee of the CPRE. What does your Committee intend to do to mitigate the adverse effects of far too much traffic using Markwick Lane, Salt Lane, Station Lane and through Milford to the A3 as a currently vital East West traffic link? They include:

Damage to the tranquillity and beauty of the Surrey Hills AONB by the passage of too many unsuitably large commercial vehicles, also causing damage to its ancient banks and trees – air pollution, particularly from the running engines of stationary traffic in the narrow parts – dangerous speed and noise in the mile of road approaching the B2130 – delays and damage to vehicles caused by potholes, which are too infrequently and not well repaired – fly tipping – danger to cyclists - incalculable economic loss and individual stress from unforeseen hold ups in the narrow parts – inconvenience to local residents along the lanes and at the Hydestyle end damage to their properties from the too close proximity of HGVs. These effects will be aggravated by extra traffic when the Dunsfold housing scheme has been completed."

The Chairman asked Mr Jeffrey if he would like to ask his question during Item 8 on the main agenda.

2. *Andrew Bolton*

"There is an element of youth anti-social behaviour (ASB) especially in the summer evenings in Godalming. I have been told by officers that Surrey CC has recently reorganised children and youth services but this is not yet finalised. The delay is frustrating local volunteers who wish to improve facilities for young people. When will we have some surety?"

The Chairman replied that she would ensure that Mr Bolton received a reply via email.

3. *Betty Ames, Vice President of Surrey Association of Local Councils (SALC)*

"Please can the subject of a Joint Committee be on a future agenda as a firm item?"

The Chairman replied: "We're continuing to look at Joint Committees and Surrey County Council is also pursuing Partnership Boards."
