The feasibility study would investigate the possibility of installing a physical width restriction on Chalkpit Lane between the entrance and The Ridge.</p>	Pending, subject to future funding.	Area Highways Manager	<p>The application for Review of Minerals Permissions was discussed at SCC Planning and Regulatory Committee on 17 Oct. The Committee agreed a new recommendation suggested by the Leader of TDC to reduce the lorries to 112 movements a day rather than 156.</p> <p>The quarry operator has appealed the decision and the restrictions on movements cannot be imposed until the appeal is heard, currently no date for this.</p> <p>The control of HGV traffic and calming measures have been added to the ITS list for possible future funding.</p>

Request for a verbal update on the Road Safety Working Group meeting at the end of Nov.</p>	Open	Area Highways Manager	<p>The yellow backed “crossroads ahead” warning signs and yellow backed “give-way” signs were installed at this crossroads on the 12 April 2019.</p> <p>The road safety team is to install high friction surfacing on Pendell Road and Little Common Lane, on the approach to this crossroads junction.</p> <p>It was anticipated that the works would be carried out mid September, however due to the diversion route not being suitable for all HGV's to safely pass under bridges this has been delayed.</p> <p>A verbal update will be provided at the Local Committee meeting following a site visit.</p>

They advised that they do not believe regular enforcement is the appropriate way forward, since ‘the [new] speed limit has been set to meet with existing average speeds’.</p> <p>In June 2019, Highways officers reviewed the spacing between repeaters and they are in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 . Added to list but due to limited funding unable to be progressed.</p> <p><i>Committee agreed to mark as open 1/3/19.</i></p>
