

## Waverley “School Watch” Trial 2018-2019

### Why did we start the initiative?

The School Watch initiative started because of concerns raised about parking problems around some schools. Parking issues were reported around 21 schools from concerned head teachers, parents and local residents.

### What happened during the trial?

Parking services recorded the outcome of the patrols during September 2018 to July 2019 to determine if regular patrols were required during pick up times. During the trial Civil Enforcement Officers (CEO) carried out 225 patrols around 21 schools. Of the 225 patrols, 984 drivers were asked to move on and 169 Penalty Charge Notices (PCN) were given out.

The findings in the tables demonstrate that CEO’s, where possible, prefer to educate and move on drivers and only issue PCN’s as a last resort. The data collated will also provide a picture of busier periods to focus resources and enable us to look at potential trends in behaviours.

### Outcome of the trial?

The trial was a success and now forms part of our CEO regular patrols, during term time for Waverley schools, highlighted as having problems with inconsiderate and/or illegal parking. Working in partnership with schools is important to make the environment as safe as possible for our children and stakeholders.
