2. Executive summary

Frimley Health and Care is an Integrated Care System (ICS) which is a partnership of the local authorities and NHS organisations that cover the geographical footprint of East Berkshire, North East Hampshire and Surrey residents in Farnham and Surrey Heath.

This paper presents the final narrative version of the system’s 5 year narrative (2019-2024). There is strong alignment with the Surrey Health and Wellbeing Strategy with a shared ambition to ensure every person in Surrey lives to their fullest potential. It is also the system’s response to the NHS Long Term Plan.

Work has commenced to align the delivery mechanisms and structures to deliver the priorities and ambitions for Surrey residents to maximise opportunities for shared learning and delivery efficiency and effectiveness.

4. Reason for Recommendations


The strategy has been developed following discussions with a wide range of stakeholders, including members of the Surrey Health and Wellbeing Board and local residents. It is a strategy that will work alongside the Surrey Health and

Wellbeing Strategy to drive improvements in health and wellbeing for every person that lives in Surrey Heath and Farnham and will have a positive impact for Surrey residents that use services provided by providers based in the Frimley locality.

5. Detail

5.1 Integrated Care Systems (ICS) bring together local organisations to redesign care and improve population health and wellbeing, creating shared leadership and action. ICS have a key role in working with local authorities to make shared decisions on how to use resources, design services and improve population health and wellbeing.

5.2 Partners in the local health and care system worked with local people to develop the strategy using the process described below:



5.3 The strategy has 6 ambitions which the system will focus on delivering over the next 5 years.



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5.4 There is strong alignment with the 10 year Health and Wellbeing Strategy for Surrey. The 2 first strategic ambitions of the Frimley ICS Strategy match the Surrey life phases framing approach of “Start Well, Live Well and Age Well.”

5.5 There is a similar shift towards prevention and addressing the root causes of ill health and supporting people to look after themselves and those they care for and having improved access to services when they need them.

6. Challenges

The Frimley ICS is a complex system that crosses a number of Health and Wellbeing Board boundaries. A forum has been established to ensure a best fit between multiple HWBB strategies and to share learning and good practice. There is also close working between the Heartlands and Frimley ICS and their component organisations.

The solution organisational the complexity is to put people at the centred of our ambitions and delivery organisation. This can remove the boundaries that are created between systems and organisations and enable a collective focus on improvement.

Both strategies emphasis delivery models that are close to communities and at the places of Surrey heath and Farnham the two strategies come together around local residents.

7. Timescale and delivery plan

The strategy covers a 5 year timeframe with phased impact. Outcome ambitions are described on slides 16 and 17. Work is currently underway to produce a delivery

plan aligned to the strategic ambitions and wherever key indicators will be selected to align with those in the Surrey HWB Strategy.

8. How is this being communicated?

Following the election the Frimley ICS will be publishing its strategy and working with partners and communities to organise itself to deliver its ambitions.

9. Next steps

The next step in the strategy development process is to build a delivery plan for the first year of the strategy and beyond. The Frimley ICS will continue to do this in partnership with Surrey HWBB members and local authority partners.
