Waverley Small Grant awards 2012/2013


All £27,000 allocated to Waverley Local Committee for 2012/13 Small Grants was allocated across 18 projects.

Organisation	Project	Award	Status (April 2013)
Skillway, which is the trading name of one arm of the Warehouse Christian Trust.	Skillway	2000	All Grant funding used – Enabled an additional 4 young, who struggle with standard education, to benefit from the Skillway model which is to provide skills training in a range of manual activities that can provide the basis for employment when they leave school.
40 Degreez Centre for Young People	Summer outings for the FAB and Hangout Clubs	3000	<p>All grant funding used on two trips to Barfield Activity Centre with members from the FAB Club for special needs teenagers and the Hangout Club. Activities included quad biking, archery, paintballing, zip wire and many more.</p> <p>The organisation says – ‘This grant made a huge difference to the extent and type of activities we were able to put on for the young people over the summer holidays. The ethos of the 40 Degreez Centre is to be totally inclusive so we only charge the young people a nominal amount to participate in these activities and the rest is met from grants such as this. By charging them they feel ownership of the project but many cannot even afford the small amount we levy so they are subsidised 100% by grants’</p>
Aaron's Hill Youth Club	Aaron's Hill Skate Park	2000	<p>There were significant delays arranging payment of this grant as organisation worked out the best way to manage the funds. Payment was made at the end of the financial year and are being administered by Eashing Yoofie.</p> <p>Due to late payment there is no report of expenditure yet.</p>
Change of Scene	Equipping the farm	2000	<p>Part of the grant used to buy general farm equipment such as poultry fencing, solar energiser and a bee hive. Some funds remain as poor weather meant some building work needed to be carried out before expensive farm equipment was bought.</p> <p>The organisation says – ‘The expenditure to date has improved safety, hygiene and our animal care activities, thereby creating better experiences for the children who attend.’</p>

SAYERS CROFT TRUST	Sayers Croft Environmental Educational Trust	1500	Grant used to offer discounted rates for special need groups on four SEN group visits. The grant has enabled over 100 young people to experience activities they normally would not, including young people with Studio ADHD.
Pursued By A Bear Productions	The Red Seam: Community Research and Film Project	1130	Grant funding used to work with young people to create a film project.
Beacon Hill Focus Group / St Alban's Church	Hindhead Youth Project - Computers	800	All grant funds used for the purchase of laptops. The computers are used by the young people when they come to the 'youth night' sessions. The computers will also be used in some midweek afterschool activities.
Haslemere Border Athletic Club	Haslemere Border AC Junior Sportshall league	980	All grant funding used to purchase sports equipment. The grant has enabled junior members to train safely in an indoor environment and allowed them to participate competitively in the Hampshire Sports Hall league.
40 Degreez Centre for Young People	Hangout Plus (New youth group for 14+ teenagers)	4000	Grant funding used to run sessions of Hangout Plus, 16 sessions run so far (April). The organisation says – 'By being involved in the club the young people have gained self-esteem, worked well in teams and accessed valuable advice on a diverse range of issues. The small grant has enabled the 40 Degreez Centre to open and run a new youth club for an age range not catered for in the town. As a result they are able to access valuable information, learn new skills and have fun in a safe environment rather than roaming the streets.'

Woodlarks	Explorers Camp at Woodlarks	600	Small Grant Funds used to provide transport for 20 disabled young people to activities.
