Across Runnymede there are levels of deprivation close to the most affluent areas that are often hidden from view in general statistics. Virginia Water and Englefield Green West are in the 90% decile for deprivation areas in the England – meaning it is in the least deprived 10% and 90% of other areas have a higher level of deprivation (Indices of Deprivation 2019). Parts of Englefield Green East and parts of Chertsey St Ann's is in the 20% - 30% decile for deprivation meaning they have higher indices of deprivation than two thirds of the country.
